NOTE: Regarding recording answers on the front side, 1=yes, 2=no, 8=do not know and 1=correct, 2=not correct, and 8=do not know.

Instructions:

This form should be completed at each health facility visited by the supervisor. Ask the questions of n=5 parents at sick child clinic sessions (whose child were not referred to the hospital). Record the IMCI classifications (if being done) and age. Ask questions about bednets, community fever treatment, prescribed antibiotics, ORS, follow up, and appropriate home care.

Questions about pregnancy should be asked of n=5 women during their pregnancy at the antenatal clinic (if it is operating during your visit).

Data should be analyzed by district to obtain the percentage coverage of these malaria and IMCI practices and behaviors.

If information is gathered on 5 children and pregnant women in 20 health facilities visited every quarter in every district, then information should allow the district, provincial, and national level to judge whether they are reaching the target of >60% of <5 yo children and pregnant women sleeping under a treated bednet each night, and percentage coverage for other malaria and IMCI practices and behaviors.
