Summary of Edits for CY 1969

Weekly

- Run 1. a. Check Encoder tape for readability.
- b. Household records for completed interviews: transfer identification data to person records and also condition, hospital, doctor visit, special aid, and arthritis records, if present for this household.
- c. Prepare a copy of the output from this run with a table of control counts for use by the Bureau of the Census.
- Run 2. Sort by PSU X Week and Segment X Household Number X Person Number X Card Type X Card Serial Number.
- Run 3. Consistency checks within Households in preparing for Data Rejects.
- a. Household record edit--check for missing household record.
- b. Household Record Edit--check for dummy household record.
- c. Household Record Edit--check for duplicate household records.
- d. Household Record Edit--match Census segment control tape with the HIS Data tape household records. Match on sample, PSU, Week-Segment, Household Number, Card Type. Reject unmatched data records. For Unmatched Segment Control Records create a Data Record (Card Type 9) as a flag for missing data records.
- e. Household Record Edit--recode sample number and Census week to obtain processing units for tabulating purposes.

Rejects are written on Reject Output File. A table of reject counts is prepared as well as a listing of each record rejected. The listing is in two parts: data rejects and other rejects. The determination of whether data rejects are to be corrected is based on the total number of this type minus the count of "wrong record type." If this new total exceeds 50, the table and listing of rejects are sent to the Data Preparation Branch for correction of enough records to reduce the count below 50.

Corrected records are reprocessed and inserted in the week's tape.

Retain the data file for each week until all records are processed for the 13-week quarter before beginning quarterly edits and weighting runs.

Run 6. Creation of the Quarterly File. Merge data files for Weeks 01-13 by PSU X Week-Segment X Household Number X Person Number X Card Type X Record Serial Number.

Run 7. Household, Person, and Doctor Visit Intra-record Edits.

Household

1. Consistency between household serial number and special dwelling place codes.
2. Code type of living quarters when blank based on special dwelling place codes.
3. Range check of codes for place of residence.
4. Coding farm residence from land usage.
5. Deleting type B and C noninterviews from file.
6. Range check on codes for date of completion; generate day of completion, i.e., Monday, Tuesday, etc.
7. Generate numerical value for last Sunday night prior to date of interview.
8. Generate number of families in household.

Person

1. Range check on codes for race; entry of race from preceding record if blank.
2. Range check on codes for sex; entry of female if blank.
3. Range check and consistency with age for marital status.
4. Range check for each type of person-disability days; computation of number of restricted-activity days.
5. Check for consistency of dental visits in two weeks and interval since last dental visit.
6. Range check on interval since last dental visit.
7. Check for consistency of dental visits in year with interval since last visit.

Run 7. Person - continued

8. Range check and recode of interval since last doctor visit.
9. Check for consistency between doctor visits in year and interval since last visit.
10. Range check and consistency of usual activity status with sex and age.
11. Range check of limitation of activity and duration of limitation.
12. Range check of limitation of mobility and duration of limitation.
13. Range check of respondent codes; recode age of respondent.
14. Range check on education of individual, check consistency with age; generate recodes.
15. Recode veteran status; identify persons not in labor force.
16. Recode current activity status for persons aged 17+ years.
17. Range check and recodes of Industry and Occupation.
18. Range check of class of worker.
19. Range check and recodes of family income.
20. Recode of public assistance for persons with family income under \$5,000.
21. Range check of symptoms of arthritis.
22. Recode of family relationship.
23. Recodes of age.

Doctor Visit

1. Compute date of doctor visit numerical values 00-13 for past 2 weeks, 77, 88 for last week, weeks before, and assign unknown and not reported codes.
2. Recode day of week of visit from values 00-13.
3. Range check for place of visit.
4. Length of time to get to doctor: converting hours to minutes; check on valid codes.

Doctor Visit - continued

5. Range check of codes for appointment for visit.
6. Waiting time: conversion of hours to minutes; check on valid codes.
7. Range check for type of doctor.
8. Range check for reason for visit (type of service).
9. Consistency between diagnosis and treatment and condition causing visit.

Run 8. Editing and Recoding Medical Items in the Condition and Hospital Records.

1. The medical coding is performed based on the International Classification of Diseases, Eighth Revision, Adapted for Use in the United States with modifications of the code structure described in the Health Interview Survey Medical Coding Manual.
2. Prepare Diagnostic Recode #1 from the ICDA rubrics employing selected age/sex edits, and imputing the chronic/acute code when this item has been left blank.
3. Prepare Diagnostic Recode #2 from Recode #1 for conditions coded acute.
4. Prepare Diagnostic Recode #3 from Recode #1 for conditions coded chronic.
5. Prepare Diagnostic Recode #4 from Recode #1 for the cause of hospital admission.
6. Check operation code fields for blanks among fields 1-3. If blank in prior field move operation code from a latter field into blank field, e.g., operation 1 coded, operation 2 blank, operation 3 coded, move operation 3 into operation 2.
7. Edit operation codes for consistency with age and sex. Change invalid codes to an acceptable code.
8. Checking surgically treated code for deliveries in Recode #1 items 201-203; if not coded surgically treated, enter the code for operation for this diagnosis. Check consistency between Diagnostic Recodes for deliveries and appropriate operation codes.
9. Consistency check between surgically treated and operation codes.

Run 9. Condition and Hospital Intra-record Nonmedical Edits

1. Range check of condition serial numbers.
2. Range check of doctor ever seen, impute unknown or not reported as doctor seen.
3. Range check of condition days.
4. Reject minor-acute conditions not medically attended or activity restricting. This edit is in addition to the edit in the weekly Run 3.
5. Consistency check of chronic/acute code and cause of limitation; range check of cause of limitation.
6. Range check of onset and recode to one digit; imputation of unknown on basis of chronic/acute code.
7. Identifying current injuries and impairments due to injury; entry of code for doctor seen for traumatic amputation and enucleation of eye; for other impairments due to injury with onset in past 2 weeks, change onset to 2 weeks-3 months; range check of cause of injury; consistency check between codes for first injury and injury required hospitalization; consistency between code for adverse reaction and diagnostic recodes 276 and 277 (therapeutic misadventure); range check of codes for accident at work, where accident happened, cause of accident; consistency between accident at work during past 2 weeks and current activity; recode of class of accident.
8. Identifying chronic conditions carried past AA on condition page and consistency between code for doctor seen and appropriate questions past AA.
9. Range check for treatment of condition not seen by doctor (item 18).
10. Range check of codes for items 19-24, doctor seen.
11. Range check for bed days in past year.
12. Consistency between frequency of bother and how bothers (item 26 a, b); range check for codes for items 26 c, d.



Hospital

1. Computation of "J" value and recode for hospital episodes using date of admission, length of stay and date of last Sunday night.
2. Range check of type of service; recode of type of service.
3. Assign short-stay episode number.
4. Range check for type of ownership.
5. Range check of codes for first hospitalization for this condition, if blank, enter "No."

Run 10. Inter-Record Edits and Record Arranger.

Inter-Record Edits

1. Consistency between Condition days of disability and person days of disability, by type of day: sum of condition days should be equal to or greater than person days; if sum of RA condition days is zero, RA person days should be zero also; if sum of RA condition days is not zero and person days are zero, replace person days with the days of each type in the condition record with the largest number of days; if RA condition and person days are not zero, and sum of condition days is not greater than or equal to person days, replace person days sum of condition days of each type.
2. Consistency between limitation of activity in person record and cause of limitation in condition records:
  - a. Person has at least one chronic condition.
  - b. Person has one chronic condition coded cause of limitation.
  - c. Person has limitation of activity.

If a and b but not c, change person record to limited in other activities.

If a and c, change person to not limited.

If a only, change duration of limitation to blank.

If a is negative (no chronic conditions), change limitation of activity and mobility to "not applicable," and duration to blank.

Inter-Record Edits - continued

3. Persons with 1+ chronic conditions:
  - a. Person has at least one chronic condition coded cause of limitation.
  - b. Person has limitation of mobility.

If a and not b, person record changed to show limitation 4:  
"has trouble getting around alone."

If b and not a, person record changed to not limited.  
Duration of limitation on person record changed to agree with person limitation.

4. Consistency between interval since last doctor visit and doctor visit record.
  - a. Interval coded visit in past two weeks.
  - b. At least one doctor visit record.

If a and not b, change interval to 2 weeks-6 months.

If b and not a, change interval to visit in two weeks.

5. Transfer of condition data to Doctor Visit records for conditions causing visit for diagnosis and treatment.

8. Transfer size of family from household record to persons in each family.
9. Rearrange records to final tape format and perform all record-to-record transfers.

Run 11. Creation of Segment Control Tape File (RC File)

1. Match R (library tape) with C (weekly segment control tape) to make composite record--RC tape. The R tape is a Master File used for the entire year which is supplied by the Bureau of the Census. The C tape is prepared from the weekly Segment Control Listings furnished by Census.
2. Computation of the adjusted basic weight. The basic weight of 5400 is multiplied by Segment/Special household inflation factors.
3. Selection and storage of appropriate first-stage ratios from the RC records.

Run 12. First-Stage Ratio Adjustment.

1. Adjustment for color-residence distribution from the 1960 Decennial Census.
2. Generate SMSA-NonSMSA residence recode.
3. Generate Urban-Rural residence recode.

Run 13. Sorting Run.

Run 14. Adjustment for Nonresponse

1. Segment and Tab Area nonresponse adjustment factors are computed and stored.
2. Adjust weight in Person Records by nonresponse factors.

Run 15. Second-Stage Ratio Adjustment

1. Age-sex-color factors are computed and stored. Independent population estimates are furnished by the Bureau of the Census each quarter for 60 age-sex-color groups from which these factors are computed.
2. The weight in the Person records is adjusted by these ASA factors.
3. These final weights are transferred to all records associated with a person.

Run 16. Creation of Final Tape Files by Record Type.

1. Compute estimates of the raw data items to assist in table preparation. For example, multiply days of restricted activity by the 6.5 weight to give a total of restricted activity days for a person.
2. Compute weights for a quarter, annual, biannual from the quarterly basic weight and from the 6.5 weight. The 6.5 weight obtains estimates for a 13 quarter using 2-week period ( $6.5 \times 2 = 13$  weeks).

Diagnostic Recode #1

Diseases, Injuries, and Impairments

- I. Purpose: Recode #1 is a list of 278 categories of diseases and injuries selected from the complete list of 3- and 4-digit categories of the International Classification of Diseases, Adapted for Use in the United States (ICDA), 8th Revision, as modified for survey purposes. In addition, a complete list of types and sites of impairments of the Classification of Impairments (X-code) completes the recode. The recode has been used as a device to simplify tabulating of diagnostic information. In general, this recode contains the greatest amount of detail tabulated; very rarely are the 4-digit ICDA rubrics used for final tabulation purposes.
  
- II. Content: Each line of the recode contains the following elements: recode number, title summarizing the contents, and the equivalent rubric numbers from the ICDA. The full detail of all modifications of the ICDA is shown in the Medical Coding Manual, Appendix III. A summary listing of modifications which directly affect the use of the recode is shown as follows:
  - (a) The letter "S" following a rubric means that this is a special number devised for survey purposes which is not to be found in the ICDA.
  - (b) Certain ICDA rubrics are recoded to other locations within the list of rubrics; these recoded ICDA rubrics are shown in parentheses in the recode listing.
  - (c) ICDA rubrics for impairments and most of the late effects of diseases are not used in the survey medical coding and, therefore are not shown in Recode #1. Impairments and their causes, as reported by the household members, are coded directly to the X-codes according to a system that differs considerably from the ICDA method. A complete description of the Classification of Impairments (X-code) is given in the Medical Coding Manual.
  - (d) The abbreviations "NOS," "NEC," and "Pt." represent, respectively, "not otherwise specified," "not elsewhere classified," and "part."
  
- III. A log of changes in Recode #1 is attached. The log indicates the date of the change, the previous notation and the changed notation.

Acute Conditions

I. Purpose: Recode #2 consists of 33 4-digit categories of frequently reported acute conditions. These acute condition categories have been selected from the more extensive diagnostic listing in Diagnostic Recode #1 following the definition of acute condition shown below. Categories shown in this recode are used for summary tabulation and publication.

II. Arrangement of the Recode: The first two digits of the recode are to be used for subtotals for use in the annual Acute Conditions report. The first digit will be used to separate the data into the five major condition groups, and the second digit into subcategories of these five. The third and fourth digits are the basic units of the recode.

III. Definition of Acute Condition: For the purposes of the Health Interview Survey an acute condition is any disease or injury with onset in the 3-month reference period prior to the week of interview, exclusive of certain conditions always classed as chronic regardless of date of onset. The incidence of acute conditions is limited to acute conditions with onset in the 2-week reference period prior to the interview week. Acute conditions also include current deliveries, normal or complicated, and current complications of pregnancy and the puerperium. Acute conditions must have had either activity restriction or medical attention in order to be included in the survey statistics.

Acute conditions, as defined, are given a supplementary 1-digit code number identifying them as acute, and are sorted for tabulation under Recode #2 categories on this basis. Also, the incidence of acute conditions is tabulated under Recodes #1 and #2 only for those conditions with onset in the 2-week period prior to interview.

IV. Content: Each line of the recode contains the following elements: Recode #2 number, title summarizing the contents of the category, Recode #1 inclusions, and rubric numbers from the International Classification of Diseases (ICDA), 8th Revision.

A summary listing of modifications which affect the use of the recode is shown as follows:

- (a) The letter "S" following an ICDA rubric means that this is a special number devised for survey purposes which is not to be found in the ICDA.

These categories have been selected from the more extensive diagnostic listing in Diagnostic Recode #1 following definitions shown below. Categories shown in this recode are used for summary tabulation and publication purposes.

II. Definition of Chronic Condition and Impairment: For the purposes of the Health Interview Survey a chronic condition and an impairment are any departures from normal health with onset more than 3 months from date of interview, except certain complications of pregnancy. Also included are certain conditions listed on the check lists of chronic conditions and impairments which are classed as chronic regardless of the date of onset. All chronic conditions are counted in the survey whether or not they have necessitated activity restriction or medical care. All impairments coded with "X" in the first digit are, by definition, chronic.

Chronic conditions and impairments, as defined, are given a supplementary 1-digit code number identifying them as chronic and are sorted for tabulation under Recode #3 categories on this basis.

III. Content: Each line of the recode contains the following elements: Recode #3 number, title summarizing the contents of the category, Recode #1 inclusions, and rubric numbers from the International Classification of Diseases (ICDA). Since the impairment categories are coded according to the Classification of Impairments (X-code) instead of the ICD method, no corresponding ICD rubric numbers are shown in the last column for these categories. See Appendix I of the Medical Coding Manual for a listing of the X-codes.

- (a) The letter "S" following an ICDA rubric number means that this is a special number devised for survey purposes which is not to be found in the ICDA.

The accompanying charts are designed to show procedures for deriving estimates from Health Interview Survey data tapes. The publication "Current Estimates" for the year 1977 is used as a source for the examples.

Each of the detailed tables from "Current Estimates" is listed in the first column of Chart 1. The column next to that, Tab. Spec. #, shows the number of the tabulation specification from which these data are drawn and the next column shows which columns on the tabulation specification contain that particular data set. For example, Table 1 in "Current Estimates," "Incidence of Acute Conditions, Percent Distribution, etc." is derived from tabulation specification C1, Column 1.

Note that not all the columns in the tabulation specifications contain data that were used in this publication, and that tabulation specifications are not included in this package for all the detailed tables.

## HEALTH INTERVIEW SURVEY - 1977

### TABULATION SPECIFICATIONS AND WEIGHTING

#### INTRODUCTION

The tabulation specifications which were used to tabulate data for the "Current Estimates" report are attached. A brief description of the key points of each tabulation used to prepare each table is shown on the attached chart.

The weighting procedure used requires some explanation. If the table to be prepared has used only one quarter of data (for instance, the second quarter of data collected during April-June, as evidenced by the Code 2 in the processing quarter field 19) the appropriate weights are shown under the quarterly column of the tabulation specification, e.g., C-1, and if the entire tape for the year is run, use the weights in the Annual column.

The weight for an event occurring or not occurring (binomial 0 or 1) uses the basic weights for the person. Similarly, if the event has occurred and when it occurs it can have a frequency of 1, 2, 3, etc.; the weight shown includes the cross product of the person's weight times the frequency. For instance, suppose a person is injured and requires 5 days in bed, thus the weight shown in the appropriate table is the person's weight times 5.

In most instances in the Health Interview Survey there are three reference periods used to make estimates: the 2-week reference period, 6 months, and 12 months. In producing estimates two weights are presented in the tape records; the Basic Weight and the 6.5 Weight.

The 6.5 Weight is a modification of the Basic Weight obtained by multiplying the Basic Weight by 6.5. The figure 6.5 indicates that 2 weeks multiplied by 6.5 represents 13 weeks or one calendar quarter. Summing over 4 calendar quarters equals 52 weeks. The Basic Weight for a quarter is 4 times the size of the Annual Weight.

To illustrate the use of reference periods, suppose we have a person whose weight is 6,000 in the tape for the quarter. This person's annual weight is  $6000/4 = 1500$ . His 6.5 weight is obtained by multiplying  $6000 \times 6.5$  to obtain the 6.5 weight of 39,000. Therefore, if this person had 2 doctor visits occurring in the 2-week reference period, his contribution to the annual volume of doctor visits would have been  $39,000 \times 2$  or 78,000. If he had been discharged from a hospital once during the 6 months prior to interview, his contribution to the annual volume of hospital discharges would be  $1500 \times 2$  or 3000 for the full year's sample, or  $6000 \times 2$  or 12,000 for a sample of one quarter. If the reference period was 12 months, the weight for the year's sample is 1500 (or 6000 for the quarterly sample).

The weights in the original tapes were presented in binary format. In the tape release package, all binary weights have been converted to character format. However, the previous binary weight tape locations are also shown in the tape format since much of the tape documentation is based on the HIS working tape files which uses the binary weights.

The weights are presented in character format in the tape in locations 201-254. Locations from 254 onward contain cross products of variables with frequency greater than one. For instance, the number of restricted activity days in the Person record locations 106-107 may be, say, 5 days. As a convenience in tabulation, these 5 days have been multiplied times the appropriate weight (the 6.5 weight in Locations 237-245) to obtain the weighted estimate of restricted activity days in Locations 255-263.
