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**1-7. Increase the inclusion of sentinel core competencies in health promotion and disease prevention in health professions training.**

**1-7e. Baccalaureate-level nurse (B.S.N., B.A., or B.S. degree) – Counseling for health promotion and disease prevention.**

**Comments** American Association of Colleges of Nursing, (conducted September 1999) Survey on Women’s Health in the Entry-level Baccalaureate Nursing School Curriculum was conducted to inform a project funded by five federal agencies addressing women’s health. The overall response rate to the survey was 64% (n=334). In 2008, a follow-up survey, the Association of Colleges of Nursing Special Healthy People Survey of Entry-Level Baccalaureate Nursing School Curriculum, was conducted, with 451 of 614 schools (73%) responding.

Objective 1-7 moved from developmental to measurable status at the Healthy People 2010 midcourse review. Eight subobjectives were created, addressing the core competencies of health promotion and disease prevention counseling and cultural diversity in the training of medical doctors (M.D.), osteopathic doctors (O.D.), baccalaureate nurses (B.S.N., B.A., or B.S.), and nurse practitioners (N.P.).
