

## Healthy People 2010 Operational Definition

### **27-14. Reduce the illegal sales rate to minors through enforcement of laws prohibiting the sale of tobacco products to minors.**

<b>Comments</b>	As required by the Synar Amendment, all 50 States and the District of Columbia submit their baseline sales rates in compliance checks to SAMHSA as part of their annual Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment (SAPT) block grant applications.

SAMHSA also tracks 8 territories that receive the SAPT Block Grants.

The original target of “all US territories” was revised to 8 territories; however the intent of the objective remains unchanged. The target was changed to quantify the number of territories tracked by the data source.

This objective is defined differently from Healthy People 2000 objective 3.13, which targets States and the District of Columbia that have a 20 percent or less illegal buy rate among minors. In addition, objective 3.13 did not target U.S. territories.
