Objective 9-6 moved from developmental to measurable during the Healthy People 2010 Midcourse Review. Three subobjectives were created: 9-6a focuses on males who have gone to a family planning clinic with their female partner; 9-6b addresses males who have gone to a family planning clinic for himself; and 9-6c addresses males who have received birth control counseling from a doctor.

For some measures, data do not meet the criteria for statistical reliability, data quality, or confidentiality and have been suppressed. Information on suppression of data for the major Healthy People 2010 data systems has been published in a *Healthy People Statistical Note*.¹
