

## Healthy People 2010 Operational Definition

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### **14-23. Maintain vaccination coverage levels for children in licensed day care facilities and children in kindergarten.**

#### **Children in day care**

#### **14-23b. Measles/mumps/rubella vaccines.**

<b>State Data Source</b>	Annual Immunization Assessment Reports, CDC, NCIRD.
<b>Healthy People 2000 Objective</b>	Adapted from 20.11 (Immunization and Infectious Diseases).
<b>Changes since the 2000 Publication</b>	None.
<b>Measure</b>	Percent.
<b>Baseline (Year)</b>	89 (1997-98)
<b>Target</b>	95
<b>Target-Setting Method</b>	Consistent with the year 2000 target.  For a discussion of target-setting methods, see Part A, section 4.
<b>Numerator</b>	Number of surveyed enrollees in day care centers who received the combination of measles, mumps, and rubella antigens.
<b>Denominator</b>	Number of surveyed enrollees in day care centers.
<b>Population Targeted</b>	U.S. day care center population.
<b>Questions Used To Obtain the National Baseline Data</b>	CDC Annual Immunization Assessment Report: Day Care Centers, Head Start Centers, and Schools.
<b>Expected Periodicity</b>	Annual.
<b>Comments</b>	Data are collected in the fall of each year. States may collect and/or report data on selective antigens depending upon school entry requirements.  Overall (national) mean coverage levels are

estimated by weighting the vaccine-specific coverage levels reported by States and territories to their respective birth cohorts.

Sampling methodology may vary by State.

Objective 14-23 was adapted from Healthy People 2000 objective 20.11, which tracked completion of the basic immunization series by children in licensed daycare facilities and children in grades K through 12. Objective 14-23 tracks the individual antigens in the basic series for children in day care and those in kindergarten.
