Guided Questions

1. What specific challenges do your tribal health departments face in terms of funding and capacity building, and how can CDC/ATSDR better support overcoming these challenges?
2. What barriers do tribal health departments encounter in achieving public health accreditation? How can CDC/ATSDR assist in accessing, collecting, analyzing and sharing data?
3. How can CDC/ATSDR improve its response to health issues impacting tribal communities, such as opioid overdose prevention and the increasing public health threat of congenital syphilis?
4. What challenges have tribes encountered when working with state health departments and CDC/ATSDR during public health emergencies (e.g. COVID-19 pandemic, natural disasters, opioid crisis, etc.), and how can coordination and communication be improved?
