Objective 11-4 moved from developmental to measurable in September 2006. Seven subobjectives were created, each addressing a different aspect of website quality.

The baseline value is 0.1%, with a relative standard error of 92.31%. The Healthy People 2010 Steering Committee agreed to show a baseline value so that the full set of criteria could be assessed.

Another data point is expected in 2009.
