Persons aged 18 years and older are classified as having an activity limitation if they responded that lung/breathing problems caused limitations.

Persons under age 18 years are classified as having an activity limitation if they responded that asthma/breathing problems caused limitations.

There was a methodological change in the numerator and in the denominator 'ever asthma' plus an asthma attack to 'current' asthma (yes to 'ever asthma' and yes to 'still asthma') to maintain consistency with the Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists (CSTE) case definition for asthma.

The original 1994-1996 baseline of 20 percent was revised to 10 percent for 1997 as a result of

changes in the survey. The 1997 baseline of 10 percent was changed to 14 percent due to the methodological change in the denominator. The baseline year was changed from 1997 to 2001 due to the change in methodology. In 2001 the question 'do you still have asthma?' was added to the NHIS child and adult questionnaires. The target of 6 percent was proportionally adjusted to 7 percent to reflect the revised baseline using the original target-setting method.

Data are age adjusted to the 2000 standard population using the age groups under 18 years, 18-44, 45-54, 55-64, 65-74 and 75 years and over. Age-adjusted rates are weighted sums of age-specific rates. For a discussion of age adjustment, see Part A, section 7.

This objective tracks the same measure as Healthy People objective 17.4; however, data to monitor objective 17.4 were not age adjusted.

For some measures, data do not meet the criteria for statistical reliability, data quality, or confidentiality and have been suppressed. Information on suppression of data for the major Healthy People 2010 data systems has been published in a *Healthy People Statistical Note*. <sup>1</sup>
