Comments This subobjective moved from developmental to

measuring the combined average Federal and State tax on spit tobacco to measuring the number of States and D.C. that increase their taxes on smokeless tobacco.

The original baseline of 8 States was revised to 3 States after the Healthy People 2010 Midcourse Review. The original target of 51 States did not change.

This objective differs from Healthy People 2000 objective 3.23, which tracked tobacco excise tax as a percent of the retail price.
