Comments Persons are considered to live in homes tested for

radon concentrations if they report that they have heard of radon and that their household air has been tested for the presence of radon.

Data are age adjusted to the 2000 standard population using age groups: <18, 18-44, 45-54, 55-64, 65-74, and 75 years and older. Age-adjusted percents are weighted sums of age-specific percents. For a discussion of age adjustment, see Part A, section 7.

This objective was adapted from Healthy People 2000 objective 11.6, which tracked the number of homes inhabited by smokers and by children that were tested for radon. Unlike the current objective, the Healthy People 2000 data were not ageadjusted.

For some measures, data do not meet the criteria for statistical reliability, data quality, or confidentiality and have been suppressed. Information on suppression of data for the major Healthy People 2010 data systems has been published in a *Healthy People Statistical Note*.¹
