	The original baseline was revised from 0.85 (1987- 92) to 1.10 (1998) assaults per 100 workers as the result of the NCVS redesign. The target was proportionally adjusted from 0.60 to 0.78 assaults per 100 workers to reflect the revised baseline using the original target setting method.
