Comments

This measure was revised to match the way that SAMHSA now measures these data. The measure was changed from a 'rate per 1,000 person years exposure' to a 'percent'. Initiation of cigarette use in the 12 months prior to date of interview was identified by examining the youth's interview date, birth date, and initiation date of first cigarette use.

The baseline was revised from 59.6 to 6.7 after this revision to the measure. The target was proportionally adjusted from 48.1 to 4.4 to reflect the revised baseline using the original target-setting method.

Objective 27-3 moved from developmental to measurable during the Healthy People 2010 Midcourse Review. Two subobjectives were created, one focusing on children and adolescents aged 12 to 17 years, and a second on young adults aged 18 to 25 years.

For some measures, data do not meet the criteria for statistical reliability, data quality, or confidentiality and have been suppressed. Information on suppression of data for the major Healthy People 2010 data systems has been published in a *Healthy People Statistical Note.*¹
