downloaded from Lexis-Nexis, an on-line legal database. CDC, OSH searches two Lexis-Nexis subfiles: the State Track System and the Advanced Legislative Services System. The downloads are coded according to variables identified by CDC,

OSH, which include the comprehensiveness of the law, that is, minimum age for legal sale, inclusion of chewing tobacco and/or snuff, enforcement authority, penalty for violation, prohibition of purchase, possession and/or use by minors, etc.

The original baseline was changed from 34 to 22 after a re-analysis of the laws in the data system. The target of 51 did not change.

The baseline was later revised from 22 to 23 after the data in the STATE System was updated as part of a quality assurance process. The target did not change.
