Data files containing imputed family income and personal earnings figures with dollar amounts top-coded to the 95th percentile were released. Injury Episode File

A revised 2014 Injury Episode file was released. The revised file includes ICD-9-CM diagnostic codes (variables ICD9_1-ICD9_8) and external cause codes (variables ECODE_1T-ECODE_3T and related recode ECAUS). Compared to the file originally released, 4 non-injury records have been removed based on these codes. During the 2014 data editing process, a total of 347 injury and poisoning episodes were removed out of an initial total of 3,536.
