National Health Care Surveys | System Mark Usage Guide

This guide describes how and when system marks for the National Health Care Surveys should be applied to communication products. It includes sections on <u>design</u>, <u>trademark</u>, <u>application</u>, <u>sizing</u>, <u>spacing</u>, <u>usage</u>, <u>color</u>, <u>typography</u>, and <u>clearance</u>.

High-resolution PNG files for each National Health Care Surveys system mark can be downloaded from the <u>OIS' shared drive</u>. These files should only be used for electronic products. For print products, Illustrator files are available on the drive.

Universal system mark for use on materials describing National Health Care Surveys as a whole












Individual system marks for use on materials describing specific National Health Care Surveys

Design:

Two versions of the four survey-specific system marks are available for usage, including combination marks (icon and text) and brandmarks (icon only, text has been eliminated). Only a brandmark version is available for the National Health Care System system mark.







Brandmark (icon only)

Trademark:

The TM representing trademark has been applied to your system marks signifying that the required trademark search has been completed and that CDC has reviewed and approved the marks. This ensures that your system mark does not infring against similar brands or services.

The TM symbol is a required element on all National Health Care Surveys system marks. The system marks cannot be altered in any way. Altering the system marks could affect trademark integrity.







Application: Positioning


The CDC logo must be included on any product released by NCHS, including National Health Care Surveys products. However, National Health Care Surveys system marks should not be placed in close proximity to the CDC logo or any other agency logo. The CDC logo should always appear on the front page of multi-page documents within the page margins at the bottom of the page. In most cases, National Health Care Surveys system marks should be placed in the header or within body text.

Application: Vertical Orientation

The vertical lockup presents best in square or vertical layout formats, such as in pop up banners, in marketing posters, and on web pages (body).



Application: Horizontal Orientation

The horizontal lockup presents best in web banners, on letterhead (masthead), and in places where the vertical lockup does not fit.




Application: Brandmark Only

The brandmark includes the icon only (text has been eliminated). This version should be used when design space is limited and using the full lockup is not possible because the visual elements in the shield and the survey name are not readable. The brandmark may also be used on products when the full survey name or acronym are used in close proximity to the brandmark and repeating this information would be redundant. This version may be suitable for website banners (if accompanying text includes the survey name), social media graphics, and other products viewed primarily on smart devices.

When using the brandmark version in communication materials, fully spell out the survey name the first time it appears in text. If the survey name is used more than once, include the acronym in parenthesis after the full spelling. Use the acronym on all subsequent references in text (note the exception below).

When describing all National Health Care Surveys, always use the brandmark (combination mark is not available). Do not abbreviate "National Health Care Surveys" in text because this may cause confusion between materials describing all National Health Care Surveys and the National Hospital Care Survey.



Minimum Sizing:

Space availability will affect the sizing of your system marks. However, the image and text on your system marks must always be discernible. The following minimum height recommendations are required for all digital and print products:





minimum height = 1 inch (72px)

(minimum height = 0.5 inch (36px))

When applying any of the National Health Care Surveys system marks, there should be ample blank space surrounding the mark, and placement must be kept inside page margins or content-safe areas. In the example below, the black squares represent equal spacing on all sides from the edge of the mark to the next element or page margin.

Example: Spacing around the system mark must be a minimum of 1/4 inch on all sides with a recommended spacing of 1/2 inch or more.





Improper Use:

The following examples illustrate common mistakes when applying a system mark to products or templates:



Avoid distorting the proportions by holding down the Shift key while sizing from a corner node.

(Lock aspect ratio when possible.)



Do not place the system mark on a low contrast background. A minimum text color contrast of (4.5:1) must be maintained for Section 508 compliance. If the background color cannot be changed, use the reversed out version.



Do not change the system mark from its intended color. However, black and white and reversed-out versions are allowable for products not printed in color.



Do not place the system mark in close proximity to the CDC logo.

Color Palette:

Each National Health Care Surveys system mark has its own color palette, which include primary (top row) and complementary colors (bottom row). The primary colors are part of the system mark design, and the complementary colors, approved NCHS hues, should be used when designing materials featuring each system mark. This usage will create a stronger brand identity for NCHS and your surveys.

Reversed-out versions of each National Health Care Surveys system mark are only allowable when the mark is placed on photographs or on darker, block color backgrounds (see example on page 5). In these versions, the white font in the survey names and acronyms ensures that your marks remain identifiable and 508 compliant.





Typography:

Do not alter the font—Leelawadee UI bold—used in the National Health Care Surveys system marks. When designing internal and external materials that feature text, use approved font styles for titles, headlines, subheadings, and body copy. OIS recommends using one of the following font style families for titles, headlines, subheadings, and body copy:

Title: Avenir LT Std (20-point font)
Headings: Avenir LT Std 95 Black (16-point font)

Subheadings: Avenir LT Std 85 Heavy (14-point font)

Body Text (Sans Serif): Avenir LT Std 45 Book (12-point font)

Title: Cambria Bold (20-point font)

Headings: Cambria Bold (16-point font)
Subheadings: Cambria Bold (14-point font)

Redu Text(Sorif) Combria Border (12 point font)

Body Text(Serif): Cambria Regular (12-point font)

National Health Care Surveys | System Mark Usage Guide

Clearance:

Any new products that feature any NCHS system mark or the CDC logo must be approved by the NCHS Associate Director for Communications (ADC) before they can be disseminated to the public in any format. This includes materials produced inhouse by an NCHS program or division or by a contractor. The only exception to this rule is products using approved CDC templates, such as presentation slides and posters.

During ADC review, OIS will ensure that usage rules and other CDC branding guidance are followed, and that the final product reflects communication science best practices. To request ADC review, email materials to dvp2@cdc.gov.
