May 28, 2010 -- Re-release of 2008 Sample Adult Files

Some discrepancies had been identified between estimates in this report and estimates calculated using the 2008 NHIS Sample Adult Public Use data file that was released in June 2009. NCHS has determined that the cause of the discrepancies was a processing error that created sampling weights in the Public Use file that did not undergo a final adjustment step. While only 510 cases were affected, NCHS decided to release a revised 2008 Sample Adult Public Use data file. For more information, go the following link.

July 28, 2010 -- DISABILITY QUESTIONS TESTS 2008/2009 FILE

The Disability Questions Tests 2008/2009 file contains five calendar quarters of person-level data collected via a field test of six disability questions. The questions appeared on the NHIS, at the end of the Family Core, beginning in October 2008 and running through December 2009. Conducted using a split-ballot format, the field test comprised one component of a larger testing effort to develop and adopt a standard set of disability questions to be used with multiple surveys across multiple countries.

July 15, 2010 --Update the 5/27/10 Re-released 2008 Sample Adult Files

It came to the NHIS staff's attention on 7/15/2010 that although the 2008 NHIS Sample Adult file was re-released on 5/27/2010 on the NHIS Website, a problem with CDC's FTP server in early June 2010 resulted in the system restoring the version of the file that was originally released in June 2009. The correct re-released 2008 NHIS Sample Adult file was again placed on the NHIS Website on 7/15/2010.

November 15, 2012 -- Release of 2004-2010 Sample Child Birth Weight Mini-files

Some discrepancies were identified in birth weight data after the major re-engineering effort of the 2004 NHIS instrument and data production processes. From 2004-2010, discrepancies were found among children with very low birth weights of less than 500 grams and among children with very large birth weights of 10 pounds or more. NHIS has determined that the causes of the discrepancies were processing errors which have been corrected. Relatively few cases (about 2% each year) were affected.

NHIS has released Sample Child Birth Weight Mini-files with revised birth weight data for 2004-2010. The new variables (TOTOZ_P and BWTGRM_P) on the mini-files contain the corrected Sample Child birth weight data and should replace the birth weight variables on the original 2004-2010 Sample Child files. The new 2008
