**Comments** A family is considered having difficulty or delay in obtaining care if the head of the household responds "yes" to any of the questions listed above.

In 2010, the original baseline and baseline year were revised from 12 percent in 1996 to 21 percent in 2002 due to changes in the survey questions. The target of 7 percent was proportionally adjusted to 9 percent to reflect the revised baseline using the original target-setting methodology.
