Comments The National Assessment of State Trauma System

Development was administered to 50 States and 3

Territories by HRSA in 2002. States were required to convene a panel of Trauma-EMS stakeholders within the State to complete the survey. The stakeholder group included representatives from professional groups such as EMS administrators, hospital administrators, trauma nurses and surgeons, rural health officers, pediatric representatives, public health officials, and others.

Baseline (2002) data for this subobjective were collected from all States except Colorado, Illinois, and West Virginia. Data were not collected for the District of Columbia. The national estimate is a weighted-average of the State-specific percents. The weight assigned to each State were determined based the 2000 U.S. Census population.

Objective 1-11 moved from developmental to measurable status at the Healthy People 2010 Midcourse Review. The objective was divided into 7 subobjectives, each addressing different aspects of prehospital emergency medical services.
