This objective uses the same measurement protocol as the comparable Healthy People 2000 objective 14.11. A description of the prenatal care measurement has been published by NCHS.²

Due to comparability issues between the prenatal care data from the 1989 and 2003 revisions of the U.S. Standard Certificate of Live Birth, tracking of this objective ended in 2002, the last year before States began to implement the 2003 revision.³

This objective is one of the measures used to track the Access to Care Leading Health Indicator. See Appendix E for a complete list.
