**Comments** The median RBC folate level is a population-

weighted estimate from the blood specimens collected from women aged 15 to 44 years as part

of the standard NHANES protocol.1

The target of 220 ng/ml was established from the median RBC folate value for women 18-44 years of age who reported taking a folic acid-containing

supplement in NHANES III in 1992-94.

The 1991-94 baseline of 160ng/ml was revised in 2007 to 158ng/ml (1988-94) due to changes in the baseline years. The target of 220 ng/ml did not change.

For some measures, data do not meet the criteria for statistical reliability, data quality, or confidentiality and have been suppressed. Information on suppression of data for the major Healthy People 2010 data systems has been published in a *Healthy People Statistical Note*.<sup>2</sup>
