The unadjusted productivity loss (in millions) has

been published previously by ONDCP.¹ Estimates subsequently were adjusted to take account of new information on the fraction of homicide deaths attributable to drug abuse and a change in the OMB-NIH-recommended discount rate for loss of expected lifetime productivity.

The average Consumer Price Index (CPI) is made available by the Bureau of Labor Statistics each year.² The Intercensal Estimates of the United States Resident population is made available by the Census Bureau.³

Objective 26-8 moved from developmental to measurable at the Healthy People 2010 Midcourse Review. Two subobjectives were created, the first addressing alcohol abuse and the second, substance abuse.
