


## Shared Risk and Protective Factor Measurement Toolkit

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#### **CoreSVIPP**

Purpose: Decrease injury and violence related morbidity and mortality in four NCIPC priority focus areas by decreasing shared risk factors and increasing shared protective factors.

### **Ideal Shared RF/PF Approach**

risk and protective factors (that are shared across multiple outcomes) are identified


Prevention

Intermediate term impact is measured via indicators of that shared risk/protective factor Long term Impact is measured via indicators of Outcome 1 (e.g., sexual violence)



Long term Impact is measured via indicators of Outcome 2 (e.g. child abuse and neglect)

Shared Risk and Protective Factor is identified to serve as the Intermediate Indicator



Provides **measures** (e.g., survey items) and **data sources** (e.g., census data) to assess shared RF/PF linked to multiple forms of *violence*
