Questions Used To Obtain the National Baseline Data	CDC Annual Immunization Assessment Report: Day Care Centers, Head Start Centers, and Schools.
Expected Periodicity	Annual.
Comments	Data are collected in the fall of each year. States may collect and/or report data on selective antigens depending upon school entry requirements. Overall (national) mean coverage levels are estimated by weighting the vaccine-specific

coverage levels reported by States and territories to their respective birth cohorts.

Sampling methodology may vary by State.

This subobjective moved from developmental to measurable during the Healthy People 2010 Midcourse Review.

Objective 14-23 was adapted from Healthy People 2000 objective 20.11, which tracked completion of the basic immunization series by children in licensed daycare facilities and children in grades K through 12. Objective 14-23 tracks the individual antigens in the basic series for children in day care and those in kindergarten.
