

Trends in Characteristics of Births by State: United States, 1990, 1995, and 2000–2002

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Abstract

Objective—This report presents U.S. and State-level data on births, birth rates, fertility rates, sex ratio, marital status, and educational attainment by race and Hispanic origin for 1990, 1995, and 2000–2002.

Methods—Data are presented in detailed tables, summary tables, maps, and graphs.

Results—In 2002 there were 4,021,726 live births in the United States, 136,486 fewer than in 1990. Despite a slight decline in the number of births nationwide, a few States witnessed significant increases in the number of live births with most of these States located in the western United States. Some of the westward shift in number of births is attributable to a growing population and some to the age and race composition of the individual States. However, real differences in fertility by State persist even when the effects of age structure and race and ethnic composition of the States' population are taken into account.

This report also presents data on sex ratios, percentage unmarried, and educational attainment of mothers. Several observations from these data are noteworthy. The proportion of births to unmarried mothers increased nationally and in every State between 1990 and 2002. Nationally the percentage of mothers with fewer than 12 years of education fell, and the percentage with 16 or more years increased for all racial and ethnic groups. However, at the State level, the percentage of women with fewer than 12 years of education increased for nearly a quarter of the States, despite near universal increases in the percentage of women with 16 or more years of education.

Introduction

State-specific natality data are of considerable interest to researchers, policymakers, news media, and the public as the

frequent requests for these data received by the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) can attest. State-specific natality data are available in a variety of NCHS publications but rarely include the age, race, and Hispanic origin detail frequently needed for meaningful comparisons over time or among States. This report supplements "Births: Final Data for 2002" (1) with more detailed State-level data and updates "Birth and Fertility Rates for States: United States, 1990" (2) with data for more recent years. This report presents birth and fertility rates, sex ratios, percentage of births to unmarried mothers, and two indicators of educational attainment of mothers residing in the United States and individual States. All tables present data in five race and Hispanic origin categories: non-Hispanic white, non-Hispanic black, American Indian, Asian or Pacific Islander (API), and Hispanic.

The text of the report summarizes national patterns and provides an overview of variations among individual States for specific data. Although the text focuses primarily on more general patterns, [tables 1–9](#) were designed for more detailed comparisons, both among States by race and Hispanic origin and within an individual State over time. It is hoped that this report will contribute to a better understanding of both spatial and temporal variation and change in the data.

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Sources and Methods

Data shown in this report are based on 100 percent of the birth certificates registered in all States and the District of Columbia. More than 99 percent of births occurring in the United States are registered (3). The data are provided to NCHS through the Vital Statistics Cooperative Program (VSCP). The VSCP includes all States, the District of Columbia, and U.S. territories. Data for the territories are not shown in this report because of the large amount of data that is unavailable. Complete natality data are not available for all territories in 1990, and revised intercensal populations are not available for calculating any of the rates for 1995.

In this report, all tabulations are by race and Hispanic origin of the mother; see “[Technical Notes](#).” Text references to American Indian births and American Indian mothers or non-Hispanic white births and non-Hispanic white mothers are used interchangeably for ease in writing.

Race and Hispanic origin are reported as separate items on the birth certificate. Therefore, births shown by race alone may be of Hispanic or non-Hispanic origin, and births of Hispanic origin may be of any race. Tables in this report show data in five categories: non-Hispanic white, non-Hispanic black, American Indian, API, and Hispanic.

Rates for 1995, 2000, and 2001 may differ from those published in “Births: Final Data for 2001” (4) and earlier reports but are consistent with those published in “Revised Birth and Fertility Rates for the 1990s and New Rates for Hispanic Populations, 2000 and 2001: United States” (5) and “Births: Final Data for 2002” (1). U.S. and State-level birth and fertility rates for 2000–2002 and the intercensal period 1991–99 are computed using populations that were produced under a cooperative agreement with the U.S. Census Bureau and are based on counts from the 2000 census.

The 2000 census included an option for individuals to report more than one race as appropriate for themselves and household members in accordance with the new 1997 Office of Management and Budget (OMB) guidelines (6); see “[Technical Notes](#).” The 1997 OMB guidelines also provide for the reporting of Asian persons separately from Native Hawaiians or other Pacific Islanders. Under the prior OMB standards (issued in 1977) data for API were collected as a single group (7). Birth certificates currently collect only one race for the mother in the same categories as specified in the 1977 guidelines (that is, the certificates do not report Asians separately from Native Hawaiians or other Pacific Islanders). Birth data by race (the numerators for birth rates) are, thus, currently incompatible with the population data collected in the 2000 census (denominators by race). To produce birth rates for 2000–2002 and revised intercensal rates for 1991–99 it was necessary to bridge the reported population data for multiple-race persons back to single-race categories. In addition, the 2000 census counts were modified to be consistent with the 1977 OMB race categories, that is, to report the data for Asian persons and Native Hawaiians or other Pacific Islanders as a combined category, API (8). The procedures used to produce the bridged populations are described elsewhere (9,10). It is anticipated that bridged population data will be used over the next few years for computing population-based rates.

Births and Birth Rates

Number of births

In 2002 there were 4,021,726 births registered in the United States, 136,486 births fewer than in 1990 (4,158,212). The number of births increased significantly in 14 States and decreased in 27 States and the District of Columbia between 1990 and 2002 ([table 1](#)).

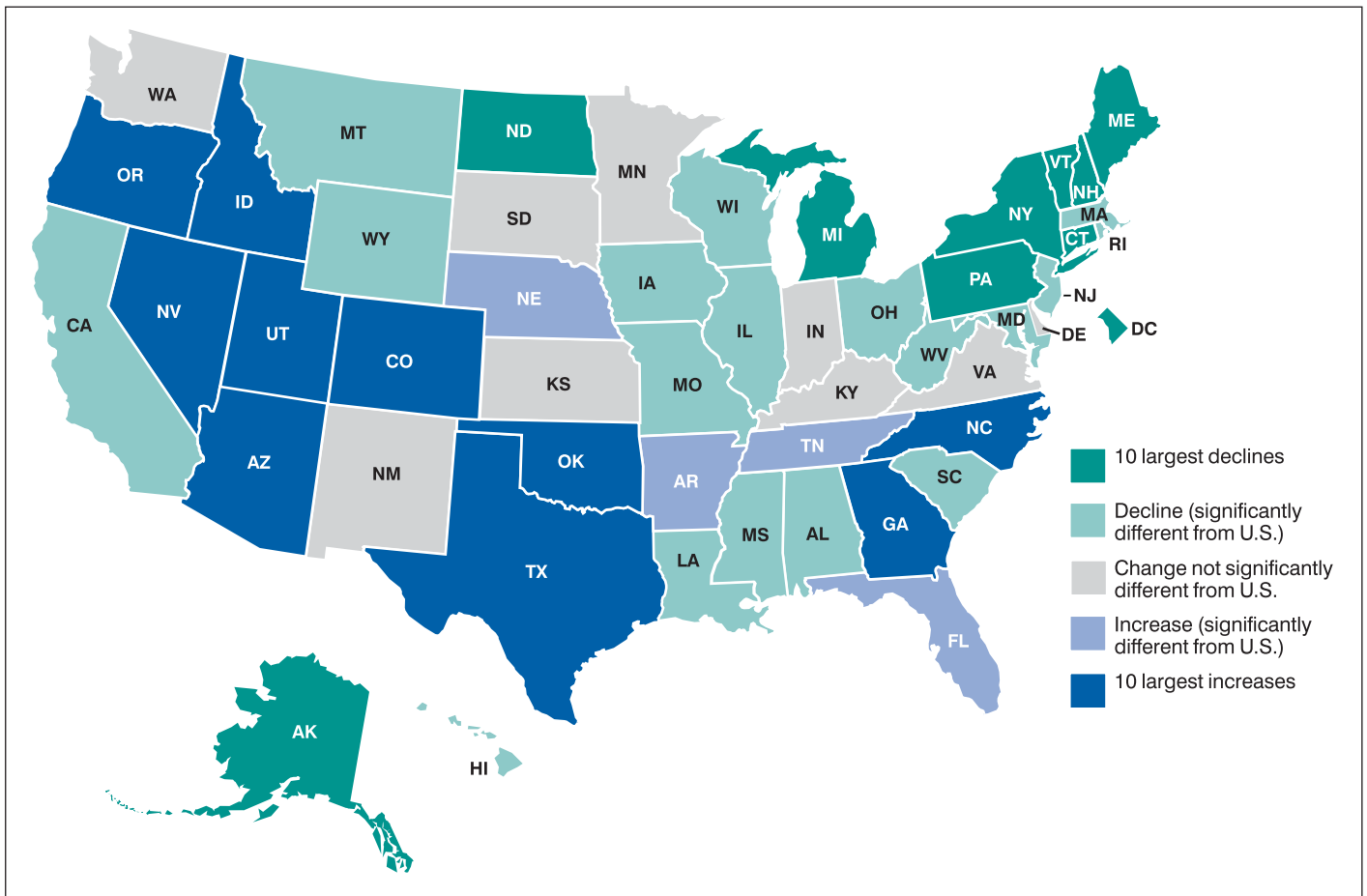


Figure 1. Percentage change in number of births between 1990 and 2002 by State

Of the 14 States with increased numbers of births, 10 were located west of the Mississippi River and included the 5 States with the largest increases (Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Nevada, and Utah) ([figure 1](#)). As a group western States have managed a small, yet significant, net increase in the number of births between 1990 and 2002. However, increased births in the West have been offset by declines in most eastern States, which as a group have accounted for a gradually decreasing proportion of all births since 1990 (56 percent in 2002 compared with 58 percent in 1990). Much of the westward shift in the distribution of births in the United States is attributable to a westward shift in the distribution of the overall population. However, notable differences persist between eastern and western States when crude birth rates, which take the size of the underlying population into account, are examined.

Crude birth rate

The crude birth rate, often simply called the birth rate, relates the number of births to the total population in the area. It is expressed as the total number of live births per 1,000 population, without regard to the age or sex distribution of the population.

In 2002 the crude birth rate by State ranged from 10 births per 1,000 total population in Maine and Vermont to 21 per 1,000 in Utah ([table 2](#)). Between 1990 and 2002 the U.S. birth rate fell 17 percent from 16.7 to 13.9, and in every State the birth rate fell or was unchanged. National declines by race and ethnicity between 1990 and 2002 ranged from 30 percent for non-Hispanic blacks to 13 percent for API.

General fertility rate

The general fertility rate, commonly referred to as the fertility rate, is one of the most basic measures of fertility. It relates the total number of births in an area to the population most at risk of childbearing—women 15–44 years of age. The general fertility rate is the number of live births per 1,000 women in this age group.

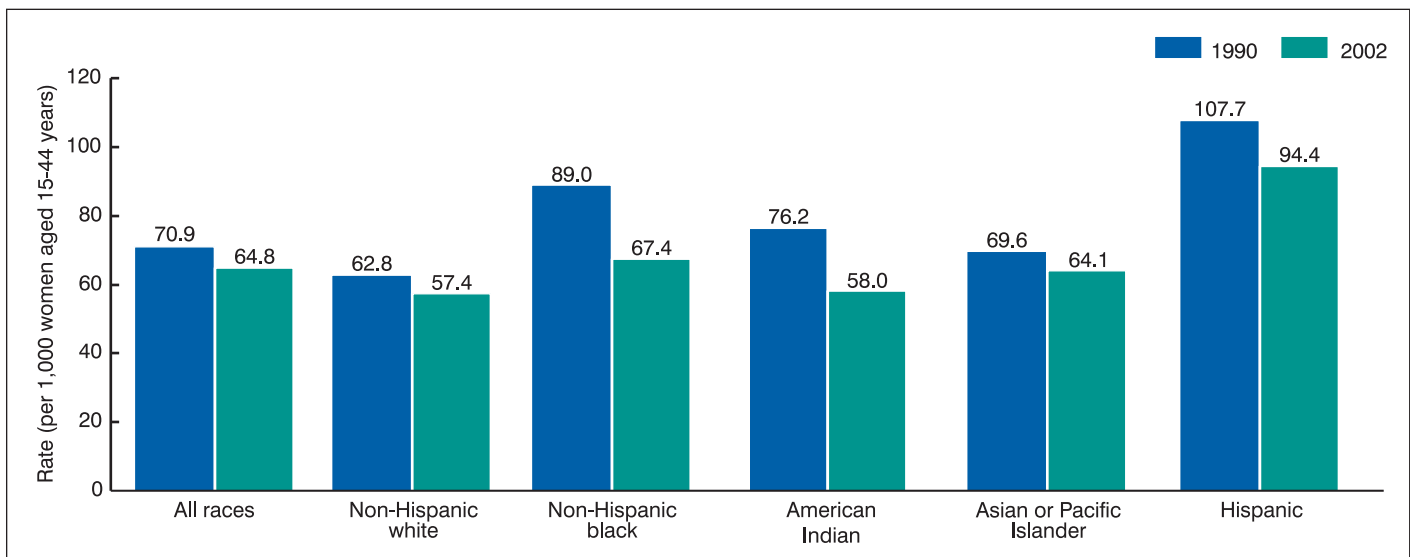


Figure 2. Fertility rate: United States, 1990 and 2002

Between 1990 and 2002 the U.S. fertility rate declined 9 percent from 70.9 to 64.8 births per 1,000 women aged 15–44 years ([table 3](#), [figure 2](#)). The fertility rate dropped most for non-Hispanic black women (24 percent). The fertility rate fell the least for API women (8 percent) but with considerable year-to-year fluctuation.

In 2002 the State-specific fertility rates ranged from a low of 49 births per 1,000 women aged 15–44 years (Vermont) to a high of 91 (Utah). Between 1990 and 2002 fertility rates declined significantly in 42 States and the District of Columbia. Six States were essentially unchanged (Idaho, Nebraska, North Carolina, Texas, Utah, and West Virginia). Only Colorado and Oklahoma had significantly higher fertility rates in 2002 than in 1990.

The general fertility rate does not control for the age, race, and ethnic composition of a State’s population. See “[Total fertility rate](#)” for a comparison of fertility that controls for population composition among States.

Age-specific birth rates

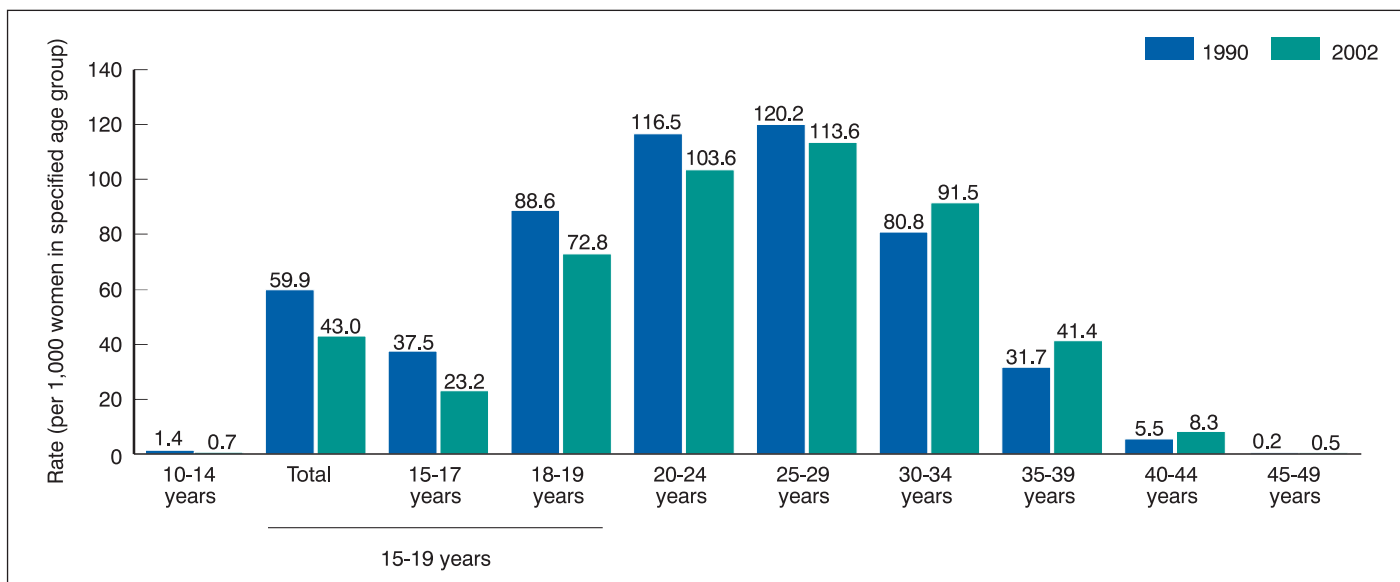


Figure 3. Age-specific birth rates: United States, 1990 and 2002

Age-specific birth rates relate the number of births to all mothers in a given age group to the total female population of the same age. In this report, age-specific birth rates (table 4) are expressed as the number of births to mothers in a particular age group per 1,000

women in that age group. In general, age-specific birth rates have declined for women under age 30 and increased for women age 30 and over between 1990 and 2002 (figure 3). Age-specific birth rates control for variations in age structure among States but not race and ethnic composition. See "Total fertility rate" for a discussion of the

impact a population's racial and ethnic composition can have on the comparability of age-specific rates among States.

Teenagers—In 2002 State-specific birth rates per 1,000 women aged 15–19 years ranged from 20.0 (New Hampshire) to 64.7 (Mississippi). The highest rate reported for 2002 was for the District of Columbia (69.1). Between 1990 and 2002 teenage birth rates declined significantly in every State and the District of Columbia.

Women in their twenties—Nationally birth rates for women in their twenties were significantly lower in 2002 than in 1990. Although rates were 11 percent lower in 2002 than in 1990 for women aged 20–24 years, the rate was only 5 percent lower for women aged 25–29 years. Between 1990 and 2002 birth rates for women in their twenties fell inconsistently. Rates were lower in 1995, but by 2000 birth rates were once again above the mid-decade levels. Rates for women aged 20–24 years have since returned to a downward trend, and rates for women aged 25–29 years have stayed close to the 2000 rate.

Birth rates by State for women aged 20–24 years were significantly lower in 2002 than 1990 in all except four States (Alaska, Colorado, New Jersey, and Texas) where the birth rates were essentially unchanged. The difference between 1990 and 2002 birth rates for women aged 25–29 years by State varied much more. Rates for 2002 were higher in 10 States, lower in 25 States and the District of Columbia, and about the same in 15 States.

Women in their thirties—Nationally birth rates for women in their thirties were significantly higher in 2002 than in 1990. For women aged 30–34 years the 2002 rate (91.5) was 13 percent higher than in 1990 (80.8). The 2002 birth rate for women aged 35–39 years was 31 percent higher than in 1990.

Birth rates by State were higher in 2002 than in 1990 in every State except California and the District of Columbia for women aged 30–34 years. Rates were higher in every State and the District of Columbia for women aged 35–39 years.

Women in their forties—Birth rates for women in their forties were significantly higher in 2002 than in 1990. Although the rates are much lower for women in their forties than for those in their thirties, the magnitude of difference between 1990 and 2002 rates increased notably with advancing age. Rates for women aged 40–44 years

increased 51 percent from 5.5 to 8.3 births per 1,000 women. Over the same time period rates for women aged 45–49 years more than doubled from 0.2 to 0.5.

Birth rates by State for women aged 40–44 years increased significantly between 1990 and 2002 for all except five States (Idaho, New Mexico, North Dakota, South Dakota, and Vermont) where the rates essentially were unchanged. Of those with significant increases, Utah increased the least (23 percent) and North Carolina the most (91 percent).

The number of births per year for women aged 45–49 years is too small to calculate reliable rates in many States. In 1990 rates could be calculated for only 19 States; however, by 2002 rates were available for 41 States. This indicates that the increase in births to women aged 45 years and over observed for the United States is broad-based and occurring in every part of the country.

Total fertility rate

One of the most useful measures of fertility is the Total Fertility Rate (TFR). The TFR summarizes the potential impact of current fertility patterns on completed family size. The TFR estimates the number of births that a hypothetical cohort of 1,000 women would have if they experienced throughout their childbearing years the same age-specific birth rates observed in a given year. The rate can be expressed as the average number of children that would be born per woman. For example, the TFR for Alabama in 2002 was 1,882.0, meaning that, on average, each woman in Alabama would have 1.9 children in her lifetime. Because it is computed from age-specific birth rates, the TFR is age-adjusted and, thus, permits comparison from place to place, across time, and among various population subgroups.

The TFR in 1990 was 2,081.0 (the highest since 1971). Since 1990 the TFR has fallen, risen, and fallen again for a net decline of 3 percent to 2,013.0 in 2002. During the first half of the 1990s the TFR fell for all major population subgroups. Declines between 1990 and 1995 ranged from 14 percent for non-Hispanic black and American Indian women to 4 percent for non-Hispanic white women. Although the TFR

for non-Hispanic white women bottomed out in 1995, the TFR for most other population groups continued to fall uninterrupted for several more years.

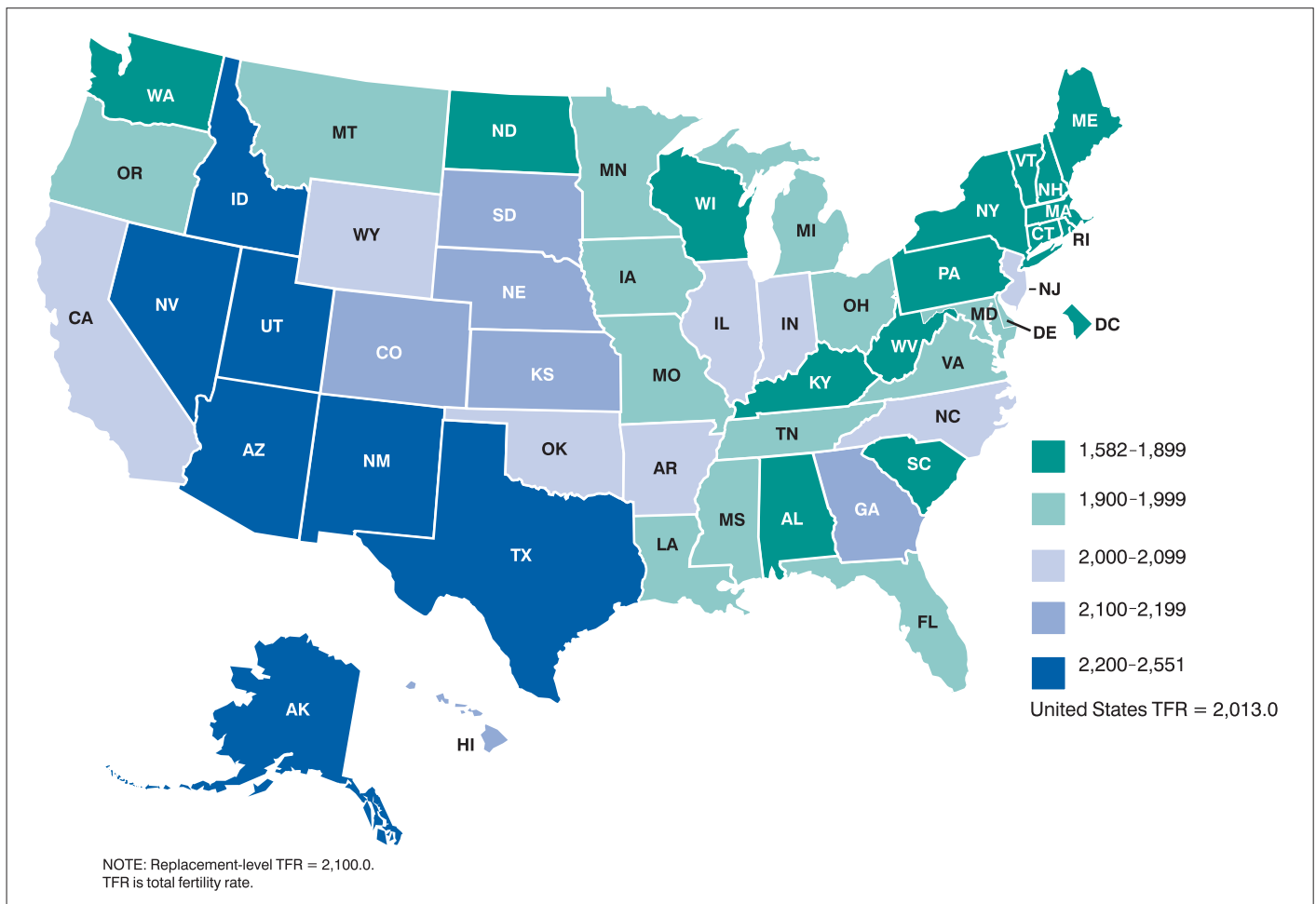


Figure 4. Total fertility rates by State, 2002

In 2002 the TFR by State ranged from 1,604.0 for Vermont to 2,550.5 for Alaska. The TFR for the District of Columbia was 1,582.5. Thirteen States were at or above replacement level (2,100.0 births per 1,000 women): Alaska, Arizona, Colorado, Georgia, Hawaii, Idaho, Kansas, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, South Dakota, Texas, and Utah. Except for Georgia, all States with TFRs above replacement level were in the western half of the United States, particularly the Southwest (figure 4). Whereas higher TFRs tended toward the Southwest, States with lower TFRs tended toward the Northeast with the five lowest rates in New England States (Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, and Vermont).

Differences in TFRs by State most directly reflect differences in size of completed families and timing of childbearing (i.e., at what age family formation begins). In turn, these differences are affected by social and economic factors. We know, for example, that the mean age of a mother at first birth tends to be higher for States in the northeastern United States (11). We know (at least at the national level) that expected family size varies among race and ethnic groups. According to the 1995 National Survey of Family Growth non-Hispanic white women expect to have 2.1 children, non-Hispanic black women expect 2.3, and Hispanic women expect 2.7 (12). Because proportions of the population

groups vary considerably by State we might conclude that expected family size would also vary by State (at least partially in response to the relative proportion of these groups). This would also help to explain the observed distribution of TFRs by State because States with smaller minority populations (such as the New England States) have lower TFRs as would be expected given the variations in expected family size. However, expected family size data are not available by State to conclusively validate these assumptions.

Standardization allows us to look at the underlying variation in TFR by controlling for the effects of each State's unique race and Hispanic origin composition. For example, it would be expected that States with relatively larger Hispanic populations would have higher overall TFRs given that Hispanic women's fertility rates are the highest of the larger population subgroups. Conversely, States with high proportions of non-Hispanic whites would be expected to have lower overall TFRs. Standardization allows us to control for this by limiting the impact of any given population group to its proportion in some standard population (in this case the U.S. population). See "Technical Notes" for a more detailed description of standardization.

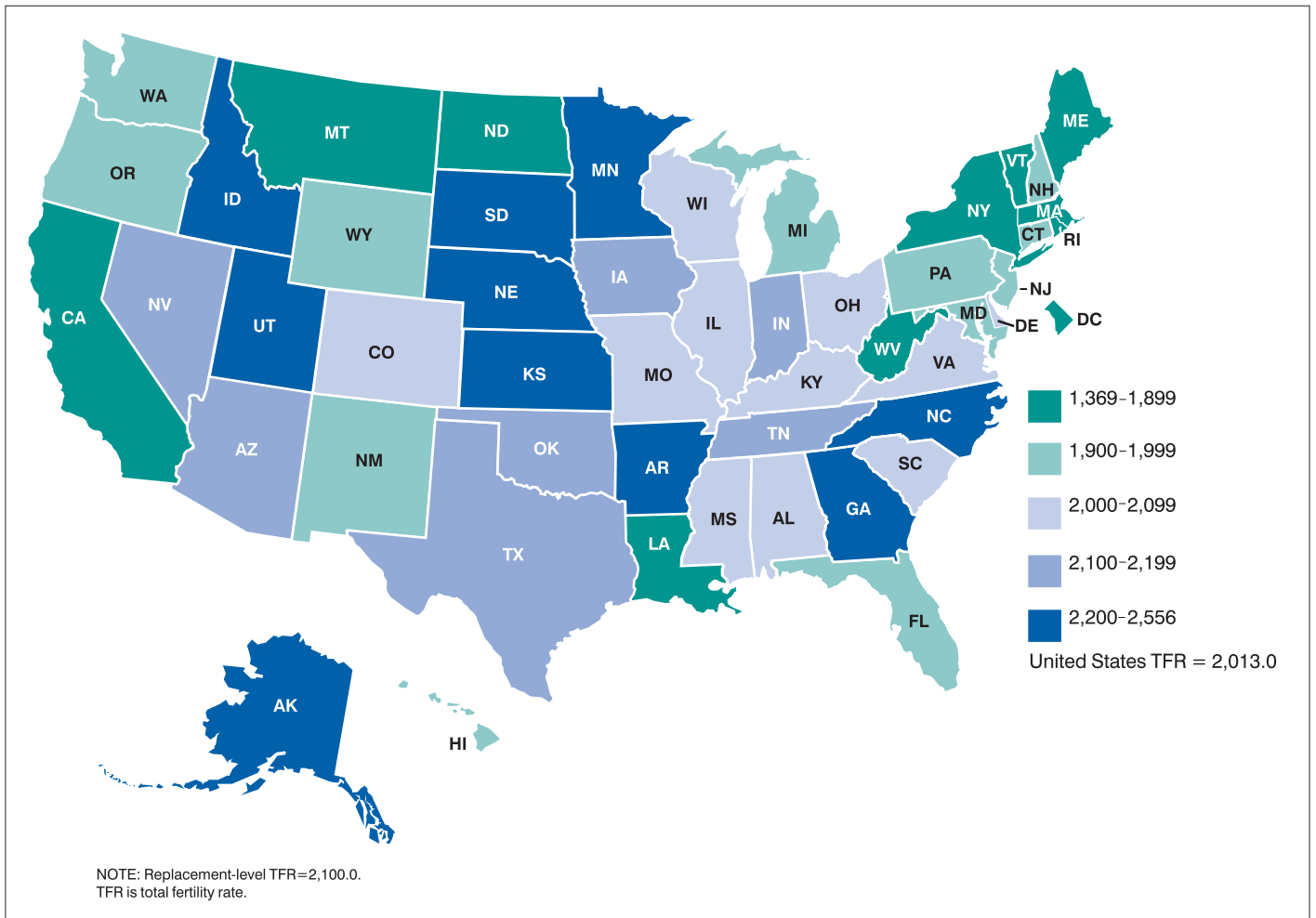


Figure 5. Standardized total fertility rates by State, 2002

Both completed family size and timing of childbearing patterns vary by race and Hispanic origin, though not causally. We might assume that, by controlling for race with standardized TFRs, much of the State-to-State variation would disappear; however, this is not the case (table A, figure 5). In fact, the range by State was wider for the

standardized TFRs than the observed TFRs. Standardized TFRs ranged from 1,411.5 for Vermont to 2,556.0 for Alaska (compared with observed TFRs of 1,604.0 to 2,550.5, respectively). The District of Columbia had the lowest standardized TFR at 1,369.0. The relationship between the observed and standardized TFRs varies depending on the region of the country and, in a few striking situations, the individual State being considered (figures 4 and 5). The standardized rates clearly continue to show the northeastern United States as a region of lower fertility. However, the group of States with the highest observed TFRs through the Southwest and West are not the highest after standardization. Clearly this is due to the large Hispanic populations found in these States. In contrast, the highest standardized TFRs are dispersed throughout the country in smaller groups or as individual States.

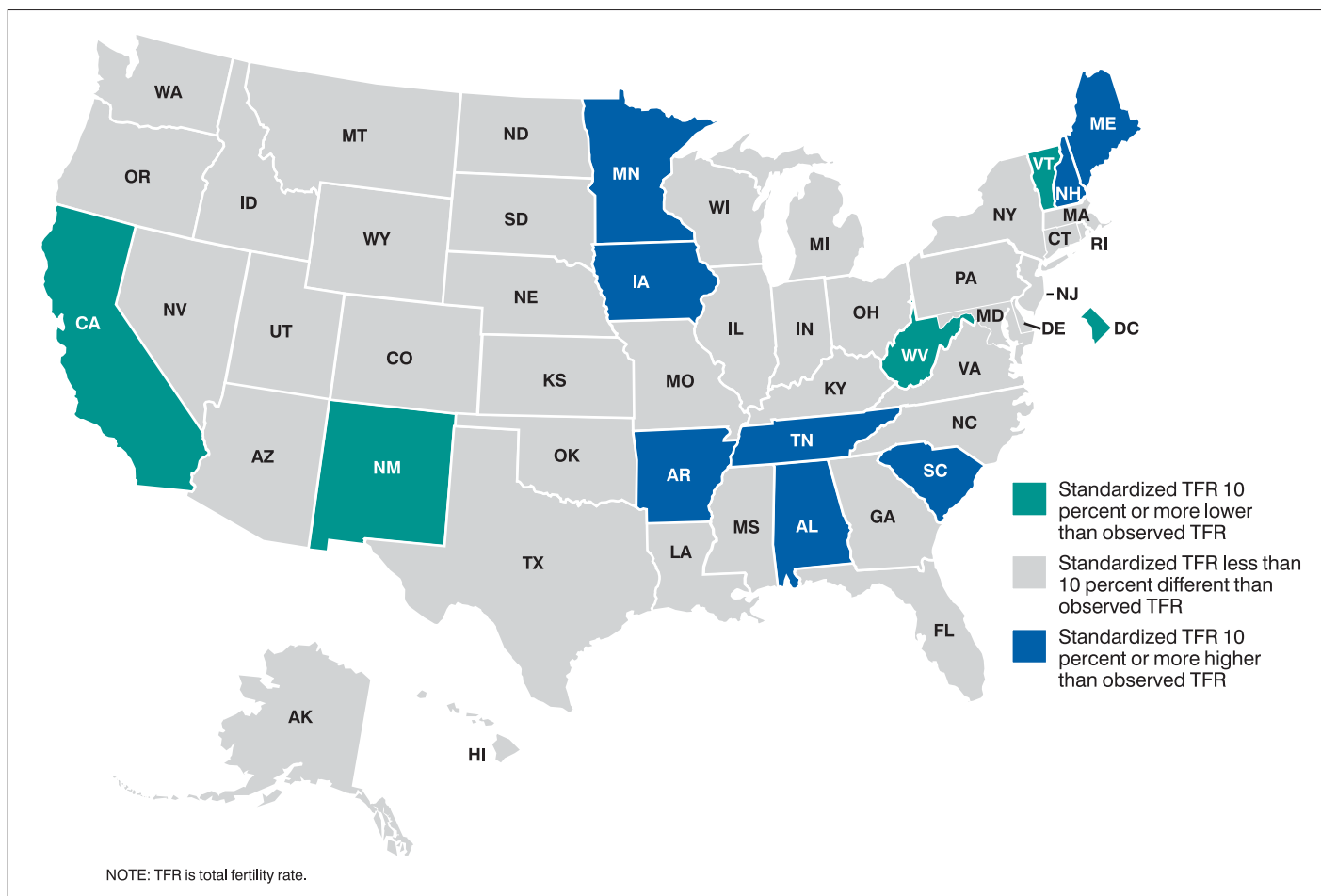


Figure 6. Difference in observed and standardized total fertility rates by State, 2002

The standardized TFR was higher than the observed TFR by 10 percent or more for eight States; the standardized TFR was less than the observed TFR by 10 percent or more for four States and the District of Columbia (figure 6). These 12 States and the District of Columbia exemplify some of the most important scenarios underlying differences between these two rates.

The eight States with standardized TFRs higher than the observed rate can be divided into those with and without large minority populations (non-Hispanic black, American Indian, API, and Hispanic). The States without large minority populations are Iowa, Maine, Minnesota, and New Hampshire. Each of these four States is around 90 percent non-Hispanic white compared with 69 percent for the United States as a whole (table I). If these States had non-Hispanic black, American Indian, and Hispanic populations proportionately as large as those in the U.S. population, the standardized rates for these States would increase dramatically. In contrast, Alabama, Arkansas, South Carolina, and Tennessee, which also had standardized TFRs higher than the

observed TFRs, all have large non-Hispanic black populations; however, like the other States these four have small Hispanic populations. If these States had Hispanic populations proportionately as large as in the U.S. population, their TFRs would increase. In all eight of these States the observed rates reflect the race and ethnic composition of the population. It is important to take compositional differences by State into account when interpreting variations in TFRs and other fertility measures.

Four States and the District of Columbia had standardized rates at least 10 percent lower than the observed TFR. Of these, California, New Mexico, and the District of Columbia had small non-Hispanic white populations (each less than 50 percent) and relatively large populations of one or more other population groups. These States have high observed TFRs due to larger proportions of groups with high fertility rates.

The other two States that have lower standardized than observed TFRs are Vermont and West Virginia. These two States illustrate limitations of using comparisons of standardized and observed TFRs to draw conclusions about population composition. Both States are over 95 percent non-Hispanic white, more similar to Minnesota and New Hampshire than to California and New Mexico.

First birth rate

First birth rates provide a measure of family formation. Compared with all other 5-year age groups, women aged 20–24 years experienced the highest first birth rates. However, when the teen category is subdivided, the oldest teens (aged 18–19 years) have first birth rates higher than women aged 20–24 years (table 5). An examination of population subgroups reveals that first birth rates

peaked at ages 18–19 years for non-Hispanic black, American Indian, and Hispanic women followed by women aged 20–24 years. Rates for non-Hispanic white and API women were at their highest for women aged 25–29 years; however, rates for non-Hispanic white women aged 18–19, 20–24, and 25–29 years were fairly similar.

Since 1990, national first birth rates have fallen for women under 30 years of age and increased for those aged 30 and over for all population groups. Declines have tended to be more rapid for younger women. Between 1990 and 2002 rates for teenage women (aged 15–19 years) fell 25 percent, but rates for women aged 25–29 years declined only 8 percent. The rate increased by 25 percent for women aged 30–34 years. This shift is directly associated with the increased median age at first birth.

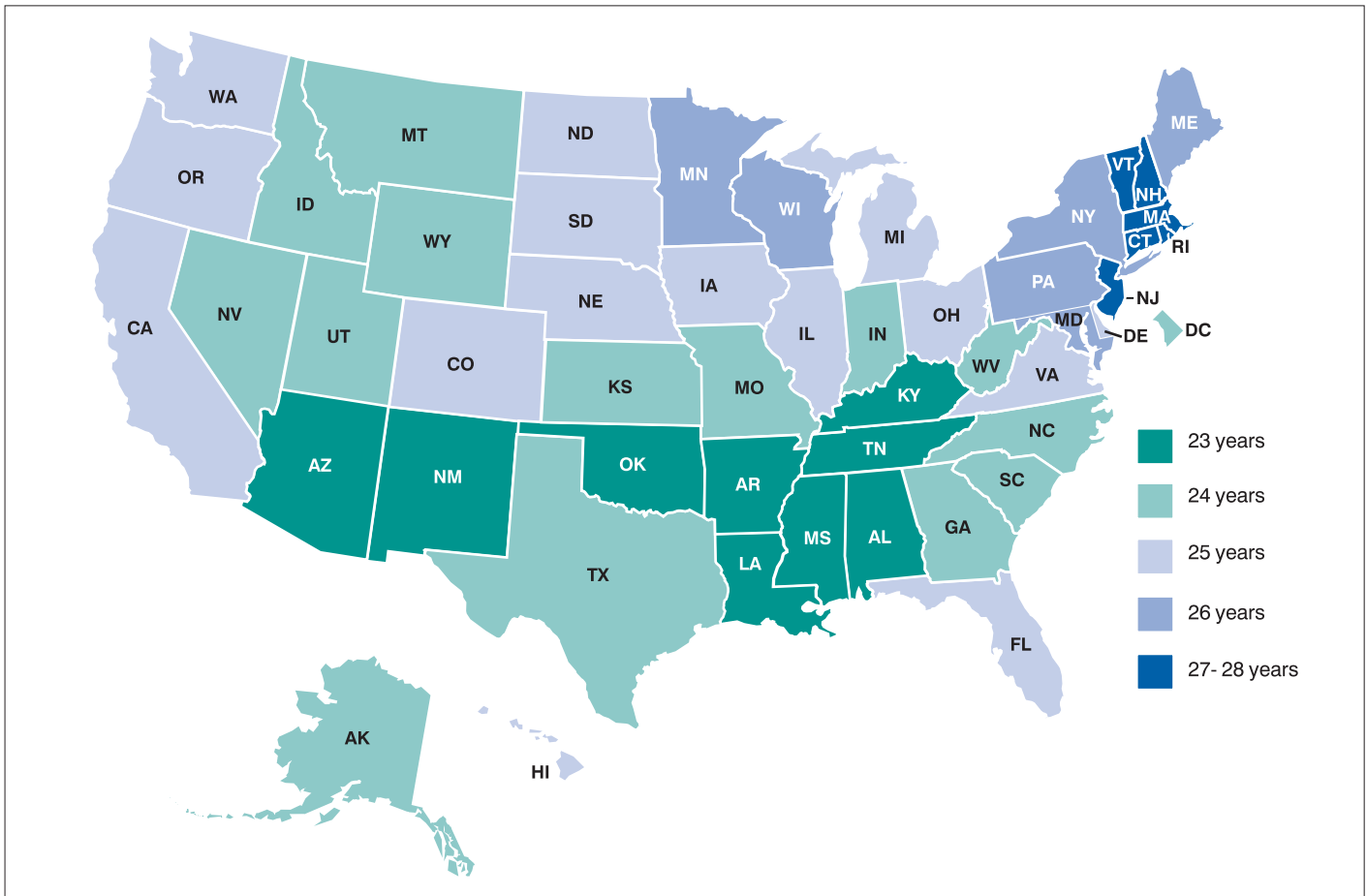


Figure 7. Median age of mother at first birth by State, 2002

Like the national numbers, most States have seen the overall first birth rate fall between 1990 and 2002 for women under age 30 and increase for women aged 30 years and over. This has resulted in an increased median age at first birth in all States. In 2002 median age tended to be highest for States in the Northeast and lowest for States in the South and Southwest (figure 7). Also see “Total fertility rate.”

Other Demographic Characteristics

Sex ratio

The U.S. sex ratio at birth fluctuated very little between 1990 and 2002 (table 6). The sex ratio is defined as male live births per 1,000 female live births. The 2002 sex ratios for all five racial and ethnic groups were similar to their 1990 sex ratios.

Observing sex ratios by State using a 3-year average provides greater stability and allows ratios to be shown for each race and ethnic group (table B). For all mothers, Hawaii had the highest sex ratio of 1,075; New Mexico had the lowest (1,030). Hawaii had the highest sex ratio (1,103) for non-Hispanic white mothers, and South Dakota had the lowest (1,036). For non-Hispanic black mothers, the highest and lowest sex ratios were in Wyoming (1,238) and Idaho (940), respectively. For American Indian mothers, the range was from 1,232 in Hawaii to 919 in Ohio. The widest range occurred for API mothers, from 1,227 in West Virginia to 900 in North Dakota. The range for Hispanic mothers was 1,164 in North Dakota (the lowest State for API) to 982 in Arkansas.

Percentage unmarried

Between 1990 and 2002 the proportion of births to unmarried mothers increased from 28 to 34 percent (table 7). Nationally the proportion of births to unmarried women has increased for all major race and ethnic population groups; however, the magnitude of the increases varies considerably by group. The most rapid increase in the proportion of births to unmarried mothers was for non-Hispanic white mothers (36 percent); the smallest was for non-Hispanic black mothers (3 percent). These changes were not large enough to change the relative rank of the groups. In 2002 API women had the lowest percentage unmarried (14.9), followed by non-Hispanic white (23.0 percent), Hispanic (43.5 percent), American Indian (59.7 percent), and non-Hispanic black women (68.4 percent). For all groups the increase in the proportion unmarried was concentrated in the first half of the 1990s. Since the middle of the decade the percentage unmarried has grown more slowly or even decreased slightly as is the case among non-Hispanic black and API women, which declined 2 and 9 percent, respectively, since 1995.

The proportion of births to unmarried mothers varies considerably by State. In 2002 the proportion unmarried ranged from 17 percent in Utah to 47 percent in Louisiana and Mississippi and 56 percent in the District of Columbia. In 2002, 22 States and the District of Columbia had a proportion of births to unmarried mothers significantly higher than the national percentage, and 25 States were significantly lower

(figure 8). States with proportions of births to unmarried mothers higher than the national value can be found throughout the United States. However, some parts of the country, most notably the Southeast, stand out with most of the States in the region having relatively high proportions of births occurring to unmarried mothers.

A State's racial and ethnic composition is clearly related to the percentage of births to unmarried mothers. States with large non-Hispanic black, American Indian, and/or Hispanic populations relative to the total tend to have a higher proportion of births to unmarried mothers. Other factors including age structure and social norms likely also contribute to the observed differences by State.

Reflecting national trends, the proportion of births to unmarried mothers increased in all States between 1990 and 2002. The only exception was the District of Columbia where the proportion of births to unmarried mothers declined significantly.

Educational attainment

Educational attainment is an important factor in fertility decisions and behaviors (12). Measurements of maternal education, both those with low and high educational attainment, have been used to understand adverse birth outcomes, timeliness of prenatal care, and behavior detrimental to pregnancy (4).

From 1990 to 2002 the percentage of women with fewer than 12 years of education fell, and the percentage with 16 or more years of

education rose for all racial and ethnic groups shown here (tables 8 and 9). American Indian mothers had the most dramatic increase in 16 or more years of education, from 4.4 percent in 1990 to 8.7 percent in 2002. The percentage with 16 or more years of education for non-Hispanic black, American Indian, and Hispanic mothers remains much lower than those for non-Hispanic white and API mothers (figure 9).

Hispanic mothers had the highest percentage of those with fewer than 12 years of education (48.1 percent in 2002). In 2002, 30.8 percent of American Indian and 24.3 percent of non-Hispanic black mothers had fewer than 12 years of education. API and non-Hispanic white mothers had similarly low percentages for those with fewer than 12 years of education (10.3 and 11.7 percent, respectively).

Twelve States (Arizona, Colorado, Delaware, Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, South Dakota, Utah, and Washington) had a significant increase in the percentage of mothers with fewer than 12 years of education between 1990 and 2002. These increases may reflect the large increases in Hispanic populations in these States, which have more than doubled in all except Colorado and New Mexico (table I). In both 1990 and 2000 Hispanic women had lower educational attainment than the overall population (13); nationally they are the population group with the smallest decline in percentage of mothers with fewer than 12 years of education (11 percent between 1990 and 2002).

Thirty-four States and the District of Columbia had a significant decrease in the percentage of mothers with fewer than 12 years of

education. Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New York, West Virginia, and the District of Columbia had a decrease of more than 23 percent for mothers with fewer than 12 years of education. North Dakota and Hawaii have had the lowest percentage of mothers with fewer than 12 years of education over the time period.

Forty-nine States and the District of Columbia had significant increases in the percentage of mothers with 16 or more years of education between 1990 and 2002. Only Alaska had a decrease in this measurement. Eighteen States had an increase of more than 50 percent. The increase for the District of Columbia was over 100 percent (from 16.0 in 1990 to 32.1 in 2002). Connecticut had the highest percentage for this measurement in 1990 (29.7), and Massachusetts had the highest in 2002 (42.9).

Conclusion

This report presents recent national and State trends for many of the most important fertility measurements and several demographic measurements. These data document State variation in fertility patterns and demographic characteristics and can be useful to researchers, policymakers, news media, or the public seeking to put a given State's rates in context or to compare it with neighboring States. The detailed tabular data include numbers, rates, and percentages for 1990, 1995, and 2000–2002 for five racial and ethnic groups, going well beyond what could be discussed in the text of the report.

In this report, several interesting results were observed and illustrated with numerous maps and graphs. For example, it was illustrated that differences in fertility by State exist even after taking into account the effects of age and race and ethnic composition. It was also shown that the proportion of births to unmarried mothers has increased for the

United States and for every State between 1990 and 2002. Finally, it was observed that, despite near universal increases in the percentage of women with 16 or more years of education by State, nearly a quarter of the States are seeing an increase in the percentage of women with fewer than 12 years of education.

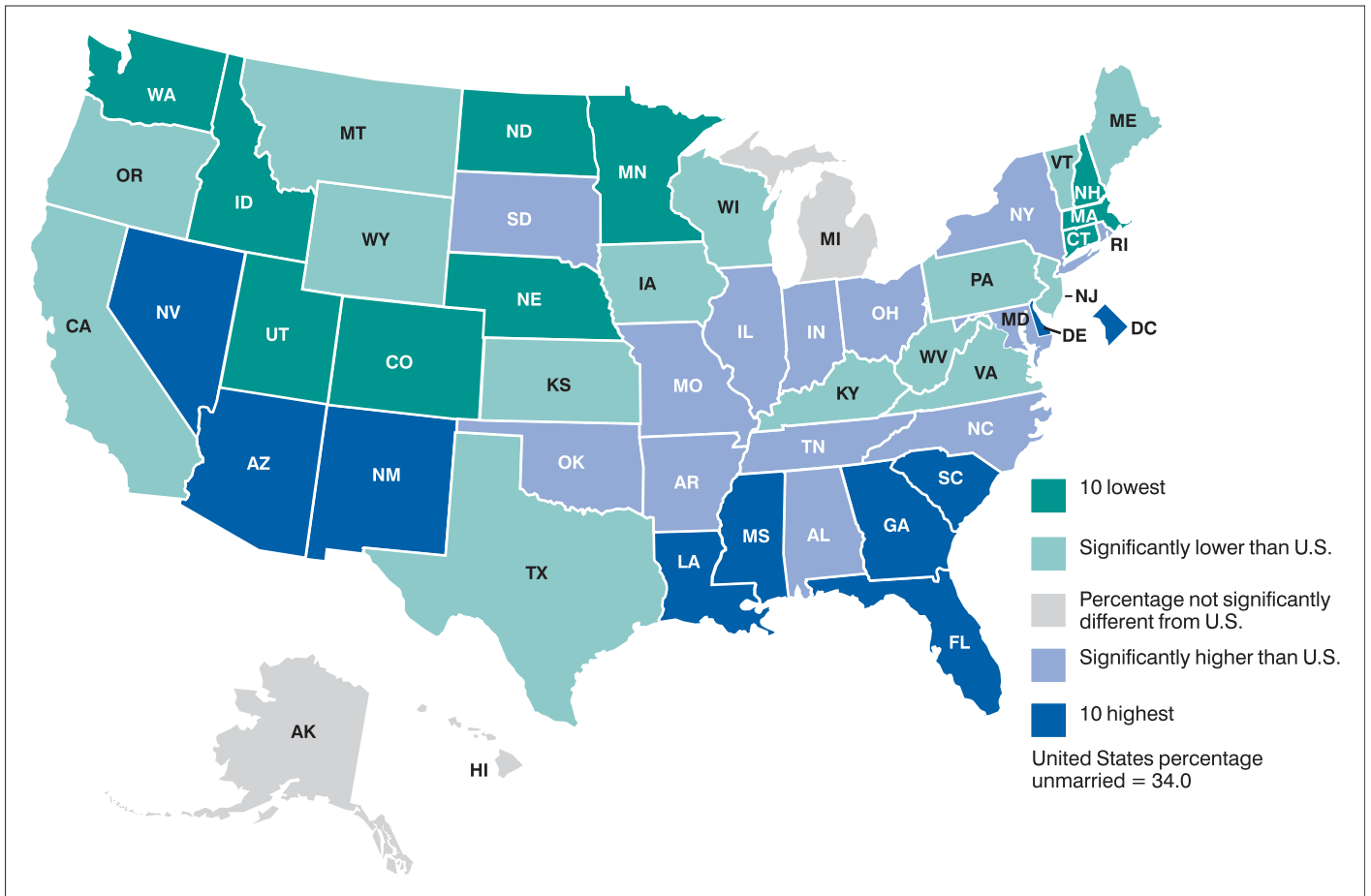


Figure 8. Percentage unmarried by State, 2002

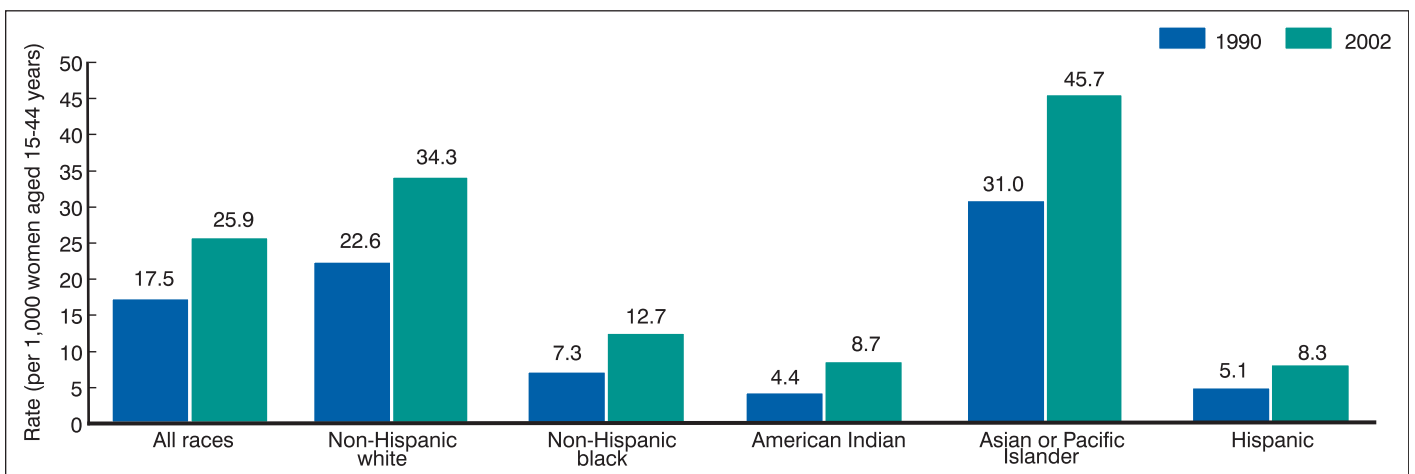


Figure 9. Percentage of births to mothers with 16 or more years of education by race and Hispanic origin of mother: United States, 1990 and 2002

Technical Notes

Sources of data

Data presented in this report are based on information reported on birth certificates filed for all births in the United States. Data are provided to NCHS through the Vital Statistics Cooperative Program (VSCP). Details on the data elements collected in the birth certificate file are discussed in previous reports (1,3,4,14–16).

Age of mother

Age of mother is computed in most cases from the mother's and infant's dates of birth as reported on the birth certificate. The mother's age is directly reported by five States (Kentucky, Nevada, North Dakota, Virginia, and Wyoming). From 1964 to 1996 mother's age was edited for ages 10–49 years. Births reported to occur to mothers under age 10 or over age 49 years had age imputed according to the age of mother from the previous record with the same race and total birth order (total of live births and fetal deaths). Beginning in 1997, age of mother is imputed for ages 9 years or under and 55 years and over. A review and verification of unedited birth data for 1996 showed that the vast majority of births reported as occurring to women aged 50 years and over were to women aged 50–54 years. The numbers of births to women aged 50–54 years are too small for computing age-specific birth rates. These births have been included with births to women aged 45–49 years for computing birth rates.

When age of mother was not reported, it was imputed according to the last record with the same race and total birth order. See annual reports for the percentage of records where age of mother was not reported (1,4,14–16).

Race and Hispanic origin

Race and Hispanic origin are reported separately on the birth certificate. Beginning with the 1989 data year, NCHS tabulated birth data primarily by race of the mother. In 1988 and prior years, births were tabulated by the race of the child, which was determined from the race of the parents as entered on the birth certificate.

Trend data by race shown in this report are by race of mother for all years. Text discussions of data by race are based on tabulations by race of mother. Text references to non-Hispanic white births and non-Hispanic white mothers or to American Indian births and American Indian mothers are used interchangeably for ease in writing.

Factors influencing the decision to tabulate births by race of the mother have been discussed in detail elsewhere (17). They include the 1989 revision of the birth certificate, which includes many more health questions that are directly associated with the mother. In these instances it is more appropriate to tabulate births by the mother's race. A second factor has been the increasing incidence of interracial parentage. In 2002, 5.4 percent of births were to parents of different races compared with just 1.9 percent for 1980. A third factor influencing the decision to tabulate births by race of mother is the large proportion of births with race of father not stated, 14 percent in 2002. Although this proportion declined slightly in the 1990s, it is still higher than in 1980, 11 percent. The high proportion of records with the father's race not reported reflects the increase in the proportion of births to unmarried women; in many such cases no information is reported on the father. These births are already assigned the race of the mother because there

is no alternative. Tabulating all births by race of mother, therefore, provides for a more uniform approach rather than a necessarily arbitrary combination of parental races.

In 1997 the OMB issued "Revisions to the Standards for the Classification of Federal Data on Race and Ethnicity" that revised the "1977 Statistical Policy Directive 15, Race and Ethnic Standards for Federal Statistics and Administrative Reporting" (6,7,9). These documents specify guidelines for collection, tabulation, and presentation of race and ethnicity data within the Federal statistical system. The 1977 standards required Federal agencies to report race-specific tabulations using a minimum set of four single-race categories: American Indian or Alaska Native, Asian or Pacific Islander, Black, and White. The 1997 revision incorporated two major changes designed to reflect changing national racial and ethnic profiles of the United States. First, the revision increased from four to five the minimum set of categories to be used by Federal agencies for identification of race. The 1997 standards specified five race categories: American Indian or Alaska Native, Asian, Black or African American, Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, and White. Collection of additional detail on race and ethnicity is permitted as before, so long as the additional categories can be aggregated into the minimum categories. Second, the revised standards also required Federal data collection programs to allow respondents to select one or more race categories.

For the 2000 decennial census the U.S. Census Bureau collected race and ethnicity data in accordance with the revised OMB standard. However, the National Vital Statistics System, which is based on data collected by the States, will not fully comply with the new standards until States revise their birth certificates to reflect the new standards. Birth certificates currently report only one race for each parent, using the categories specified in the 1977 OMB guidelines. In addition, birth certificate data do not report Asians separately from Native Hawaiians or other Pacific Islanders. Thus, beginning with the 2000 data year the numerators (births) for birth rates are incompatible with the denominators (populations) (see "Population denominators"). In order to compute rates, it is necessary to bridge the reported population data for multiple-race persons back to single-race categories. This has been done for birth rates by race presented in this report. Beginning with births occurring in 2003, several States began reporting multiple-race data. Once all States revise their birth registration systems to comply with the 1997 OMB standard, the use of bridged populations can be discontinued.

In cases where race of mother was not reported the race of the father was assigned, if known. When information was not available for either parent, the race was imputed according to the specific race of the mother on the preceding record with a known race of mother. See annual reports for the percentage of records where race of mother was not reported (1,4,14–16).

Hispanic origin and race are reported independently on the birth certificate, as noted previously. In tabulations of birth data by race only, data for persons of Hispanic origin are included in the data for each race group according to the mother's reported race. In tabulations of birth data by race and Hispanic origin, data for persons of Hispanic origin are not further classified by race because the vast majority of births to Hispanic women are reported as white. In these tabulations, data for non-Hispanic persons are classified according to the race of the mother because fertility and maternal and infant health differ substantially between Hispanic and non-Hispanic white women.

Items asking for the Hispanic origin of the mother and the father have been included on the birth certificates of all States and the District of Columbia since 1993 (18). In 1991 and 1992 New Hampshire did not ask for information on Hispanic origin; in 1990 neither New Hampshire nor Oklahoma collected this information. See annual reports for the percentage of records for which Hispanic origin of mother was not reported (1,4,14–16).

Marital status

National estimates of births to unmarried women are based on two methods of determining marital status. For 1994 through 1996 birth certificates in 45 States and the District of Columbia included a question about the mother's marital status. Beginning in 1997, the marital status of women giving birth in California and Nevada has been determined by a direct question in the birth registration process. Beginning June 15, 1998, Connecticut discontinued inferring the mother's marital status and added a direct question on mother's marital status to the State's birth certificate.

Since 1998 Michigan and New York have used inferential procedures to compile birth statistics by marital status. A birth is inferred as nonmarital if any of these factors, listed in priority-of-use order, is present: a paternity acknowledgment was received or the father's name is missing. In recent years a number of States have extended their efforts to identify the fathers when the parents are not married in order to enforce child support obligations. The presence of a paternity acknowledgment therefore is the most reliable indicator that the birth is nonmarital in the States not reporting this information directly; this is now the key indicator in the nonreporting States. Details of the changes in reporting procedures are described in previous reports (19,20).

Marital status was imputed as married for the records where the information is collected as a direct question but not reported. See annual reports for the percentage of records where marital status of mother was not reported (1,4,14–16).

Population denominators

Birth and fertility rates by State for 1990 shown in [tables 2–5](#) are based on the 1990 census. Rates by State for 1995 and 2000–2002 also shown in [tables 2–5](#) are based on populations estimated using data from the 2000 census. These populations are shown in [tables I and II](#). The population estimates for 1995 and 2000–2002 have been provided by the U.S. Census Bureau (21–24) and are consistent with the 2000 census counts by age, race, and sex, which have been modified to be consistent with 1977 OMB racial categories and historical categories for birth data. The modification procedures are described in detail elsewhere (8,9). Rates by State shown in this report may differ from rates computed on the basis of other population estimates.

The populations used in this report were produced under a collaborative arrangement with the U.S. Census Bureau and are based on the 2000 census counts. Reflecting the 1997 OMB guidelines, the 2000 census included an option for individuals to report more than one race as appropriate for themselves and household members (6). In addition, the 1997 OMB guidelines called for reporting of Asian persons separately from Native Hawaiians or other Pacific Islanders. In the earlier OMB guidelines (issued in 1977), data for API persons were collected as a single group (7). Birth certificates currently report only

one race for each parent in the categories specified in the 1977 OMB guidelines (see "Race and Hispanic origin"). In addition, birth certificate data do not report Asians separately from Native Hawaiians or other Pacific Islanders. Thus, birth certificate data by race (the numerators for birth and fertility rates) currently are incompatible with the population data collected in the 2000 census (the denominators for the rates).

In order to produce birth and fertility rates for 1991 through 2002, it was necessary to bridge the reported population data for multiple-race persons back to single-race categories. In addition, the 2000 census counts were modified to be consistent with the 1977 OMB racial categories, that is, to report data for Asian persons and Native Hawaiians or other Pacific Islanders as a combined category, API (8,25). Procedures used to produce the bridged populations are described in separate publications (9,10). Beginning with births occurring in 2003, several States began reporting multiple-race data. Once all States revise their birth certificates to comply with the 1997 OMB standard, the use of bridged populations can be discontinued.

Populations used to calculate the rates for 1995 are based on population estimates as of July 1 and were produced by the U.S. Census Bureau with support from the National Cancer Institute (5,9,26). These intercensal population estimates for 1995 are revised based on the April 1, 2000 census. The rates for 1990 and 2000 are based on populations from the censuses in those years as of April 1.

Birth and fertility rates for 1995, 2000, and 2001 shown in this report have been revised from those published in the annual reports of final data for 2001 and earlier years (4,14,15). Previously published birth and fertility rates for 1991 to 2001 were based on postcensal population estimates derived from the 1990 census. The revised rates shown here are based on revised population estimates consistent with the 2000 census. The revised population estimates are based on the 2000 census counts by age, race, and sex, that have been modified to be consistent with 1977 OMB racial categories (7) and historical categories for birth data. The modification procedures are described in detail elsewhere (9,10).

Readers should keep in mind that the population data used to compile birth and fertility rates by race and ethnicity for 1995, 2000, 2001, and 2002 shown in this report are based on special estimation procedures and are not actual counts. This is the case even for the 2000 populations that are based on the 2000 census. As a result the estimation procedures used to develop these populations may contain some errors. Smaller populations, for example, American Indians, are likely to be affected much more than larger populations by potential measurement error (9). Although the nature and magnitude of error is unknown, the potential for error should be kept in mind when evaluating trends and differentials. As more accurate information becomes available further revisions of the estimates may be necessary.

Computation of rates

In computing birth and fertility rates for the Hispanic population, births with origin of mother not stated are included with non-Hispanic births rather than being distributed. Thus, rates for the U.S. Hispanic population are underestimates of the true rates to the extent that the births with origin of mother not stated (0.6 percent in 2002) were actually to Hispanic mothers. Census-based populations with origin not stated are imputed. The effect on the rates is believed to be small.

An asterisk (*) is shown in place of any derived rate based on fewer than 20 births in the numerator or a population denominator of less than

1,000. Rates based on populations below these minimum levels lack sufficient reliability for analytic purposes. In addition, TFRs are only computed for subgroups that had at least 1,000 births in the numerator and 2,500 women aged 15–44 years in the denominator.

Birth order—In computing birth rates by birth order, births where birth order is not stated are distributed in the same proportions as births with known birth order within specified age groups. This distribution procedure is done separately for each race and Hispanic origin group as well as for all races.

Standardized rates—To eliminate the effect of differences among States in the distribution of the populations by race and Hispanic origin on the States' TFR, standardized TFRs were calculated for 2002. The standardized TFR is the sum of standardized age-specific birth rates for 5-year age groups multiplied by five. Standardized age-specific birth rates for 5-year age groups were computed using the direct method of standardization (weighted average of category-specific rates, with the weights taken from a standard population). The 2002 distributions of the U.S. female population in the corresponding 5-year age groups by race and Hispanic origin were used as the standard populations for this procedure. Five race and Hispanic origin groups were used: non-Hispanic white, non-Hispanic black, non-Hispanic American Indian, non-Hispanic API, and total Hispanic.

Random variation and significance testing for natality data

The number of births reported for an area is essentially a complete count because more than 99 percent of all births are registered. Although this number is not subject to sampling error, it may be affected by nonsampling errors in the registration process such as mistakes in recording the mother's residence or age.

When the number of births is used for analytic purposes (that is, the comparison of numbers, rates, and percentages over time, for different areas, or between different groups), the number of events that *actually* occurred can be thought of as one outcome in a large series of possible results that *could have* occurred under the same or similar circumstances. When considered in this way, the number of births is subject to random variation, and a probable range of values is estimated from the actual figures according to certain statistical assumptions.

The confidence interval is the range of values for the number of births, birth rates, or percentage of births that could be expected in 95 out of 100 cases. The confidence limits are the end points of this range of values (the highest and lowest values). Confidence limits indicate how much the number of events or rates could vary under the same or similar circumstances.

Confidence limits for numbers, rates, and percentages can be estimated from the actual number of vital events. Procedures differ for rates and percentages and also differ depending on the number of births on which these statistics are based. Detailed procedures and examples for each type of case are presented below.

When the number of vital events is large, the distribution is assumed to follow a normal distribution (where the relative standard error is small). When the number of events is small and the probability of the event is small, the distribution is assumed to follow a Poisson probability distribution. Considerable caution should be observed in interpreting the occurrence of infrequent events.

95-percent confidence limits for numbers less than 100

When the number of births is less than 100 and the rate is small, the data are assumed to follow a Poisson probability distribution (27). Confidence limits are estimated using the following formulas:

$$\text{Lower limit} = B \times L$$

$$\text{Upper limit} = B \times U$$

where

B = number of births

L = the value in [table III](#) that corresponds to the number B

U = the value in [table III](#) that corresponds to the number B

Example

Suppose that the number of first births to American Indian women 40–44 years of age was 47. The confidence limits for this number would be calculated as follows:

$$\begin{aligned} \text{Lower limit} &= 47 \times 0.73476 \\ &= 35 \end{aligned}$$

$$\begin{aligned} \text{Upper limit} &= 47 \times 1.32979 \\ &= 63 \end{aligned}$$

This means that the chances are 95 out of 100 that the actual number of first births to American Indian women 40–44 years of age would lie between 35 and 63.

95-percent confidence limits for numbers of 100 or more

When the number of events is greater than 100, the data are assumed to approximate a normal distribution. The 95-percent confidence limits are calculated as follows:

$$\text{Lower limit} = B - (1.96 \times \sqrt{B})$$

$$\text{Upper limit} = B + (1.96 \times \sqrt{B})$$

where

B = number of births

Example

Suppose that the number of first births to white women 40–44 years of age was 14,108. The 95-percent confidence limits for this number would be calculated as follows:

$$\begin{aligned} \text{Lower limit} &= 14,108 - (1.96 \times \sqrt{14,108}) \\ &= 14,108 - 233 \\ &= 13,875 \end{aligned}$$

$$\begin{aligned} \text{Upper limit} &= 14,108 + (1.96 \times \sqrt{14,108}) \\ &= 14,108 + 233 \\ &= 14,341 \end{aligned}$$

This means that the chances are 95 out of 100 that the actual number of first births to white women 40–44 years of age would lie between 13,875 and 14,341.

Computing confidence intervals for rates

The same statistical assumptions can be used to estimate the variability in birth rates. Again, one formula is used for rates based on numbers of events less than 100, and another formula is used for rates based on numbers of 100 or greater. For our purposes, assume that the denominators of these rates (the population estimates) have no error. Although this assumption is technically correct *only* for denominators based on the census that occurs every 10 years, the error in intercensal population estimates is usually small and difficult to measure; therefore, it is not considered. (See “[Population denominators.](#)”)

95-percent confidence limits for rates based on fewer than 100 events

If the number of events in the numerator is less than 20 or the population in the denominator is less than 1,000, an asterisk is shown in place of the rate to indicate that there were too few births or the population is too small to compute a statistically reliable rate. When the number of events in the numerator is greater than 20 but less than 100, the confidence interval for a rate can be estimated using the two formulas that follow and the values in [table III](#).

$$\text{Lower limit} = R \times L$$

$$\text{Upper limit} = R \times U$$

where

R = birth rate

L = the value in table III that corresponds to the number B

U = the value in table III that corresponds to the number B

Example

Suppose that the first birth rate for American Indian women 40–44 years of age was 0.50 per 1,000, based on 47 births in the numerator. Using table III,

$$\begin{aligned} \text{Lower limit} &= 0.50 \times 0.73476 \\ &= 0.37 \end{aligned}$$

$$\begin{aligned} \text{Upper limit} &= 0.50 \times 1.32979 \\ &= 0.66 \end{aligned}$$

This means that the chances are 95 out of 100 that the actual first birth rate for American Indian women 40–44 year of age lies between 0.37 and 0.66.

95-percent confidence limits for rates when the numerator is 100 or more

In this case, use the following formula for the birth rate based on the number of births:

$$\text{Lower limit} = R - [1.96 \times (R / \sqrt{B})]$$

$$\text{Upper limit} = R + [1.96 \times (R / \sqrt{B})]$$

where

R = birth rate

B = number of births

Example

Suppose that the first birth rate for white women 40–44 years of age was 1.55 per 1,000, based on 14,108 births in the numerator. Therefore, the 95-percent confidence interval would be calculated as follows:

$$\begin{aligned} \text{Lower limit} &= 1.55 - [1.96 \times (1.55 / \sqrt{14,108})] \\ &= 1.55 - 0.026 \\ &= 1.52 \end{aligned}$$

$$\begin{aligned} \text{Upper limit} &= 1.55 + [1.96 \times (1.55 / \sqrt{14,108})] \\ &= 1.55 + 0.026 \\ &= 1.58 \end{aligned}$$

This means that the chances are 95 out of 100 that the actual first birth rate for white women 40–44 years of age lies between 1.52 and 1.58.

Computing 95-percent confidence intervals for percentages

In many instances we need to compute the confidence intervals for percentages. Percentages derive from a binomial distribution. As with birth rates, an asterisk will be shown for any percentage that is

based on fewer than 20 births in the numerator. We easily compute a 95-percent confidence interval for a percentage when the following conditions are met:

$$B \times p \geq 5 \text{ and } B \times q \geq 5$$

where

B = number of births in the denominator

p = percent divided by 100

$q = 1 - p$

For natality data, these conditions will be met except for very rare events in small subgroups. If the conditions are not met, the variation in the percentage will be so large as to render the confidence intervals meaningless. When these conditions are met, the 95-percent confidence interval can be computed using the normal approximation of the binomial. The 95-percent confidence intervals are computed by the following formulas:

$$\text{Lower limit} = p - [1.96 \times (\sqrt{p \times q / B})]$$

$$\text{Upper limit} = p + [1.96 \times (\sqrt{p \times q / B})]$$

where

p = percent divided by 100

$q = 1 - p$

B = number of births in the denominator

Example

Suppose that the percentage of births to Hispanic women in Arizona that were to unmarried women was 49.7 percent. This was based on 14,751 births in the numerator and 29,682 births in the denominator. First, we test to make sure we can use the normal approximation of the binomial:

$$29,682 \times 0.497 = 14,752$$

$$29,682 \times (1 - 0.497) = 29,682 \times 0.503 = 14,930$$

Both 14,752 and 14,930 are greater than 5 so we can proceed. The 95-percent confidence interval would be calculated as follows:

$$\begin{aligned} \text{Lower limit} &= 0.497 - [1.96 \times (\sqrt{0.497 \times 0.503 / 29,682})] \\ &= 0.497 - 0.006 \\ &= 0.491 \text{ or } 49.1 \text{ percent} \end{aligned}$$

$$\begin{aligned} \text{Upper limit} &= 0.497 + [1.96 \times (\sqrt{0.497 \times 0.503 / 29,682})] \\ &= 0.497 + 0.006 \\ &= 0.503 \text{ or } 50.3 \text{ percent} \end{aligned}$$

This means that the chances are 95 out of 100 that the actual percentage of births to unmarried Hispanic women in Arizona lies between 49.1 and 50.3 percent.

Significance testing

One or both of the rates is based on fewer than 100 cases

To compare two rates when one or both of those rates are based on fewer than 100 cases, first compute the confidence

intervals for both rates. Then check to see if those intervals overlap. If they *do* overlap, the difference is not statistically significant at the 95-percent level. If they *do not* overlap, the difference is indeed statistically significant.

Example

Suppose that the first birth rate for American Indian women 40–44 years of age was 0.70 per 1,000 in year X and 0.57 in year Y. Is the rate for year X significantly higher than the rate for year Y? The two rates are based on 63 events in year X and 54 events in year Y. Both rates are based on fewer than 100 events; therefore, the first step is to compute the confidence intervals for both rates.

	Lower Limit	Upper Limit
Year X	0.54	0.90
Year Y	0.43	0.74

These two confidence intervals overlap. Therefore, the first birth rate for American Indian women 40–44 years of age in year X is not significantly higher (at the 95-percent confidence level) than the rate in year Y.

This method of comparing confidence intervals is a conservative test for statistical significance. That is, the difference between two rates may, in fact, be statistically significant even though confidence intervals for the two rates overlap (28). Thus, caution should be observed when interpreting a nonsignificant difference between two rates, especially when the lower and upper limits being compared overlap only slightly.

Both rates are based on 100 or more events

If both rates are based on 100 or more events, the difference between the two rates, irrespective of sign (+/-), is considered statistically significant if it exceeds the statistic in the formula below. This statistic equals 1.96 times the standard error for the difference between two rates.

$$1.96 \times \sqrt{\frac{R_1^2}{N_1} + \frac{R_2^2}{N_2}}$$

where

- R₁ = first rate
- R₂ = second rate
- N₁ = first number of births
- N₂ = second number of births

If the difference is **greater** than this statistic, then the difference would occur by chance fewer than 5 times out of 100. If the difference is **less than or equal to** this statistic, the difference might occur by chance more than 5 times out of 100. We say that the difference is not statistically significant at the 95-percent confidence level.

Example

Is the first birth rate for black women 40–44 years of age (1.08 per 1,000) significantly lower than the comparable rate for white women (1.55)? Both rates are based on more than 100 births (1,535 for black women and 14,108 for white women). The difference between the rates is 1.55 – 1.08 = 0.47. The statistic is then calculated as follows:

$$\begin{aligned} & 1.96 \times \sqrt{\frac{1.08^2}{1,535} + \frac{1.55^2}{14,108}} \\ & = 1.96 \times \sqrt{[(1.166/1,535) + (2.403/14,108)]} \\ & = 1.96 \times \sqrt{0.00076 + 0.00017} \\ & = 1.96 \times \sqrt{0.00093} \\ & = 1.96 \times 0.03 \\ & = 0.06 \end{aligned}$$

The difference between the rates (0.47) is greater than this statistic (0.06). Therefore, the difference is statistically significant at the 95-percent confidence level.

Testing differences between two percentages

When testing the difference between two percentages, both percentages must meet the following conditions:

$$B \times p \geq 5 \text{ and } B \times q \geq 5$$

where

- B = number of births in the denominator
- p = percent divided by 100
- q = 1 – p

If both percentages meet these conditions, then the difference between the two percentages is considered statistically significant if it is greater than the statistic in the formula below. This statistic equals 1.96 times the standard error for the difference between two percentages.

$$1.96 \times \sqrt{p \times (1 - p) \times \left(\frac{1}{B_1} + \frac{1}{B_2}\right)}$$

where

- B₁ = number of births in the denominator of the first percentage
- B₂ = number of births in the denominator of the second percentage

$$p = \frac{B_1 \times p_1 + B_2 \times p_2}{B_1 + B_2}$$

- p₁ = the first percentage
- p₂ = the second percentage

Example

Is the percentage of births to Hispanic women that were to unmarried women significantly higher in New Mexico (50.2) than in Arizona (49.7)? Suppose that the number in the denominator was 13,714 in New Mexico and 29,682 in Arizona. The necessary conditions are met for both percentages (calculations not shown). The difference between the two percentages is 0.502– 0.497 = 0.005. The statistic is then calculated as follows:

$$\begin{aligned} & 1.96 \times \sqrt{(0.499 \times (0.501) \times (0.000106609))} \\ & = 1.96 \times \sqrt{0.000026652} \\ & = 1.96 \times 0.005162563 \\ & = 0.010 \end{aligned}$$

The difference between the percentages (0.005) is less than this statistic (0.010). Therefore, the difference is not statistically significant at the 95-percent confidence level.
