**Comments**                      The Alan Guttmacher Institute (AGI) conducts a periodic survey of agencies and clinics providing subsidized family planning services in the United States and its jurisdictions. Data for this objective are derived from the periodic survey of family planning agencies (including Title X-funded agencies, health departments, hospitals, community health centers, independent clinics, and Planned Parenthood clinics).

This objective moved from developmental to measurable during the Healthy People 2010 Midcourse Review. The objective text was revised from *“Increase the proportion of health care providers that provide emergency contraception”* to *“Increase the proportion of family planning agencies that offer emergency contraception”*. The text of the objective was revised to reflect that the data collection is of methods offered at the clinic site (rather than a measure of the quantity of a service or method actually provided to clients).
