2003 NATIONAL HEALTH INTERVIEW SURVEY (NHIS) August 1, 2008 PUBLIC USE DATA RELEASE

The Public Health Service Act (Section 308 (d)) provides that the data collected by the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS), Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), may be used only for the purpose of health statistical reporting and analysis.

Any effort to determine the identity of any reported case is prohibited by this law.

NCHS does all it can to assure that the identity of data subjects cannot be disclosed. All direct identifiers, as well as any characteristics that might lead to identification, are omitted from the data files. Any intentional identification or disclosure of a person or establishment violates the assurances of confidentiality given to the providers of the information. Therefore, users will:

- 1. Use the data in these data files for statistical reporting and analysis only.
- Make no use of the identity of any person or establishment discovered inadvertently and advise the Director, NCHS, of any such discovery (301-458-4500).
- Not link these data files with individually identifiable data from other NCHS or non-NCHS data files.

By using these data, you signify your agreement to comply with the above-stated statutorily based requirements.

## INTRODUCTION

The National Health Interview Survey (NHIS) is conducted annually by the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS), Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The NHIS administers face-to-face interviews in a nationally representative sample of households. Each week a probability sample of the civilian noninstitutionalized population of the United States is interviewed by personnel of the U.S. Bureau of the Census. Information is obtained about the health and other characteristics of each member of the household.

#### 2003 NHIS STRUCTURE

The NHIS contains many similar questions every year. The repeated items are called "core questions". Beginning with a new NHIS design in 1997, these core questions were divided into three components -- Family, Sample Adult, and Sample Child. In some years, the NHIS also has supplemental questions/modules. The 2003 NHIS contains the core questions along with questions for the Healthy People 2010 Objectives module. All of these additional 2003 questions were asked of Sample Adults or Sample Children. The responses to these questions are stored in the Sample Adult and Sample Child data files.

The 2003 NHIS files consist of six questionnaires and eight data files. See the Survey Description document for more details. The following chart shows the output data files for the 2003 NHIS components:

#### 2003 NHIS FILES AND DOCUMENTATION

The various files listed below comprise the 2003 National Health Interview Survey (NHIS) public use data release. A copy of this file (README.TXT), in ASCII format, is located with each of the following file groups (survey questionnaires, data files, SAS/ SPSS/STATA input statements, and documentation).

## 2003 NHIS SURVEY QUESTIONNAIRES, ETC.

The 2003 NHIS consists of six questionnaires - Household, Family, Sample Adult, Sample Child, Immunization, and Recontact. The questionnaires that are provided with the release of the 2003 NHIS are not identical to the versions that were utilized in the field. The questionnaires provided here reflect the minor changes in data presentation that occurred during the editing process.

Flashcards were handed to the respondents to facilitate their ability to answer certain questions - these are referenced in the questionnaires. The Field Representative Manual contains the guidelines and instructions on the survey process and topic areas covered by the NHIS and was provided to the Field Representatives (also known as interviewers). Also included is a flowchart that shows how a respondent would move through the various questionnaires.

2003 NHIS DATA FILES

The 2003 NHIS has been divided into eight data files. For ease of transmission, each of the 2003 NHIS data files has been converted into a self-extracting compressed format. To load and expand a compressed file into an ASCII file, perform the following steps:

Download a compressed file onto your hard drive into an appropriate directory (folder). For example: Copy the data file HOUSEHLD.EXE into a directory called NHIS2003. To do this, create a directory on your C: drive called NHIS2003. Then, using your browser, go to the FTP site containing the 2003 NHIS data files (see address at end of this section). Right click on the HOUSEHLD.EXE file. Depending on your browser, select Save Link As... or Save Target As... Type c:\nhis2003\HOUSEHLD.EXE in the box labeled File Name and hit Enter. To then convert HOUSEHLD.EXE into the ASCII file HOUSEHLD.DAT, go to the directory NHIS2003 and do the following:

- From DOS	<ul> <li>in the c:\nhis2003 directory, type HOUSEHLD and hit Enter</li> </ul>
- From Windows	- Double-click on HOUSEHLD.EXE or
	Click the Start Button, Click Run, enter c:\nhis2003\HOUSEHLD.EXE and hit Enter.

The ASCII file HOUSEHLD.DAT will be generated which can then be used for processing by PC statistical software packages which utilize ASCII formatted input, or transferred to another computer for processing.

NOTE: The 2003 NHIS files are large in size. Please use caution and check your disk drive capacity before extracting.

NOTE: Users have encountered difficulties when downloading the data files onto their 'Desktop'. When downloading the data files, please use a separate folder (directory).

## 2003 NHIS DATA FILES' RECORD SEQUENCE

All records in the NHIS data files have first been sorted by the Household Serial Number (HHX). The Family file has been sorted by the Family Serial Number (FMX) within the Household Serial Number (HHX). The person-level files (Person, Sample Adult, Sample Child, and Immunization) have been sorted by the Person Number (PX) within the Household Serial Number (HHX). The injury files (Injury/Poison Episode and Injury/Poison Verbatim) have been sorted by Person Number (PX) and Injury/Poison Episode Number (IPEPNO) within the Household Serial Number (HHX).

#### MERGING 2003 NHIS DATA FILES

To merge data from the Household file into the Family file, or into any of the person-level files (Person, Sample Adult, Sample Child or Immunization) or into any of the episode-level files (Injury/Poison Episode and Injury/Poison Verbatim), merge by variable HHX. To merge any person-level file with another person-level file or with an episode-level file, merge by variables HHX and PX. To merge one Injury file with the other Injury file, merge by variables HHX, PX, and IPEPNO. To merge the Family file information into a person-level or episode-level file, re-sort the person-level or episode-level file by variables HHX and FMX and then merge by HHX and FMX.
